RUN REIGATE 2019

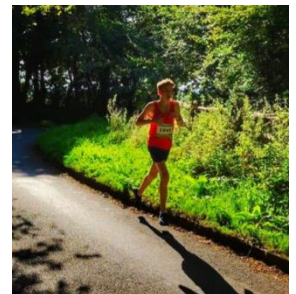
