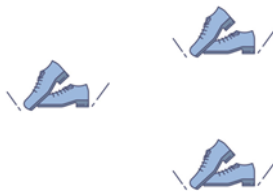
HARLEQUINS RUGBY TRIALS

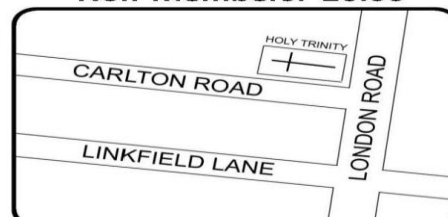

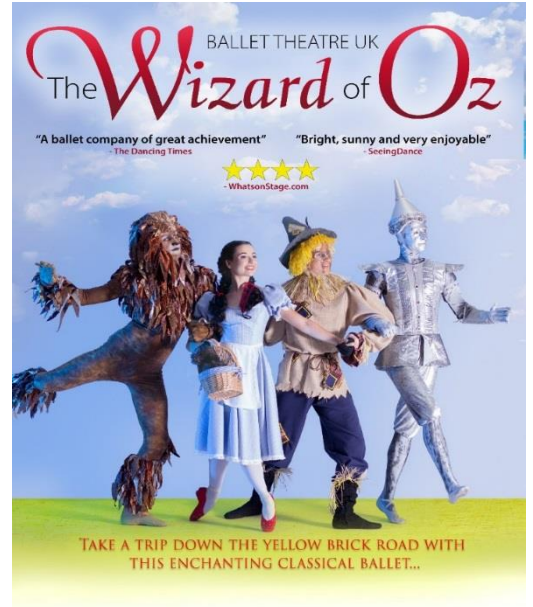
