#### ONLINE SAFETY



As you will all be aware most children spend a huge amount of their time socialising online using numerous Apps to do so. It's difficult to keep up with the pace of change in this area and the creation of new Apps, especially for parents who do not use them.

A useful tool for helping you keep your child safe is NET AWARE. This is an online resource created by the NSPCC and explains what the top 50 Apps are, what they do, age limits and how safe they are to use. This will enable you to have an informed discussion with your child.
