I am particularly pleased with how well the whole cohort performed in their maths examinations. 70% achieved A*-C grade in both English and maths with 53 students, (21%), achieving 5 or more A* and A grades. This is extremely impressive and a great indication of high quality teaching and hard-working students. Well done to the whole cohort, they are an inspiration to our current students and I wish them continued success for the future.

KIDZANIA







BARCLAYS LIFE SKILLS CAREERS DAY

During the last week of term an amazing team of 30 staff from all areas within Barclays descended on Reigate School to conduct a whole day of Careers and Lifeskills workshops. There were five workshops that each student in Year 10 had the opportunity to attend which consisted of Team Building, Debt Education, Mock Interview, Fraud Awareness and CV Writing.

In particular the students found the mock interview very helpful. They had to attend school in clothing they thought appropriate for an interview and were each asked five questions from an extensive list that they were given beforehand which enabled them to prepare and think about their answers in advance. Students were given written feedback from their interviewer which gave them praise and pointers on their answers, body language, eye contact and appearance.



The CV writing workshop taught them how to put a professional looking CV together, what it should include and what employers are looking for. The team building exercise was great fun. In small groups they had to design a fragrance, decide how they were going to market it and present their ideas to the rest of the groups and Barclays staff.

The students were very interested in the fraud awareness workshop. They were surprised by the many ways that fraudsters will try and get information in order to take their money and were given advice on how to prevent this from happening to them. Debt Education was a very useful workshop for students to understand the different types of loans and how to avoid getting into debt that could cause them difficulties in the future.

Although this event took place on the hottest day of the year so far, the students were fully engaged and participated enthusiastically. The Barclays staff were extremely impressed and commented that they would have offered several of our students a job on the spot had that been possible. It was a really worthwhile day and I would like to thank all the Barclays staff who came along and shared their expertise with our students.
