INDIA'S TRAVELS WITH THE NATIONAL YOUTH HARP ORCHESTRA

During the summer break I had the amazing opportunity to go to Budapest on a harp tour with the National Youth Harp Orchestra of Great Britain. I was very excited as this was my first time travelling abroad without my parents. When we arrived at Budapest airport it was super hot and I couldn't wait to get through security so that I could see what was beyond the cement walls. Eventually we took a coach to our hotel and unpacked before going to the hotel café for tea.

The next day we had a four hour tour by coach but luckily we had a break in between and saw the two cities of Buda and Pest from the best viewpoint in Budapest. We had three tours over all, two by coach and one by boat. We also went to the local zoo, Heroes' Square, many towns and villages and the most awesome water park ever. It was called Aquaworld. It had over 15 water slides which used rubber rings and foam mats. It had inside and outside pools and blow up balls that you go inside.

ADDITIONAL VACCINE FOR STUDENTS IN YEAR 9 AND ABOVE

Over the past few years cases of meningitis and septicaemia (blood poisoning) caused by Meningococcal group W (Men W) are rising, due to a particularly aggressive strain of the disease. Men W infections are particularly severe and usually need to be treated in intensive care, so a new vaccination, Men ACWY, is being delivered to teenagers and first-time students over the next three years.

All teenagers from year 9 onwards will be vaccinated before they complete year 13 as part of a schools-based programme, which will be delivered at the same time as they get their teenage booster for tetanus, diphtheria and polio. Young people who are currently in year 13 and students up to the age of 25 will need to contact their GP to have the vaccination; uptake nationally and locally is very low in this age group. Older teenagers and university students are at high risk of infection because many of them mix closely with lots of new people, some of whom may unknowingly carry the meningococcal bacteria

Symptoms of meningitis develop suddenly and can include:

- A high temperature (fever) over 37.5C
- A stiff neck
- · A headache
- A dislike of bright lights
- · Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea
- Drowsiness

Meningitis can occur with septicaemia. Symptoms of septicaemia include:

- Sleepiness, being less responsive or confused
- Severe muscle pains
- · Cold hands and feet
- Rapid breathing

Another symptom to look for is red or purple spots that don't fade when under pressure. Find out how to do the glass test to check for this on the Meningitis Now website.


