CERN TRIP

On Tuesday 14th February a group of 27 students and four teachers gathered at Gatwick North terminal ahead of their flight to Geneva to visit CERN and the United Nations Headquarter buildings.


Arriving in Switzerland the weather was surprisingly mild for the time of year. After dropping off bags at the hotel we headed straight to the Red Cross Museum by bus before for the afternoon visit to the United Nations Headquarters. Here security was especially, but understandably thorough. The guided tour enabled us to see a number of the meeting rooms, including the main chamber which can seat over 2000 people.



It was interesting to see the wide range of art works which have been donated by the various member countries of the UN, as well as the building itself. Later the same day we returned to the hotel with its adjacent shopping mall, and of course the local McDonalds.



The following day, with the weather still warm, we made full use of the excellent tram system and headed to the visitor centre at the CERN headquarters buildings. Here the group visited the Globe of Science and Innovation building with its unusual wooden design and a fascinating presentation called Universe of Particles and the Microcosm exhibition.

After lunch in the huge staff canteen (catering for hundreds of scientists and support staff) we were given a short introductory talk about the scale of the operations before the groups were taken on a guided tour of the main site. For the evening the group headed into the centre of Geneva for dinner at the Holy Cow restaurant. Afterwards there was time to walk along the shores of Lake Geneva.



On the last day we headed for the History of Science Museum situated in a beautiful Genevan park and were able to study the excellent and varied displays. Before heading back to the airport the group took a boat taxi affording amazing views of the famous water jet near the city centre and to catch a glimpse of the snow-topped mountains. Returning to our hotel to collect luggage, we made our way back to the airport for our return journey to Gatwick.
