MATHS CHALLENGES

Monday lunchtimes have been busy in the Maths department recently with the introduction of a lunchtime Maths session for students who enjoy completing challenging maths problems. In March some students from the group were selected to represent Reigate School in two different Team Challenges aimed at encouraging problem solving at speed in a fun competitive environment.

The first Team Challenge, run by the UK Mathematics Trust, for Year 8 and Year 9 students took place in Crawley against 23 other schools. The rounds required students to complete a cross number puzzle and solve problems in a relay where the answer for one question is needed for the next. The Reigate School students selected for this event were Euan, Joshua, Noah and Lily. They did very well against some strong opposition and thoroughly enjoyed the day.



The second Team Challenge was for Year 10 students. This competition is part of the Further Maths Support Programme that aims at encouraging GCSE students to take Maths A level. The following report is written by Bethany, one of those selected for the event alongside Natasha, Luke and Mukunth.

On Wednesday, a group of four Year 10 students went to Wallington County Grammar School to attend the Maths Feast competition. We were first faced by a series of true and false questions and this was our best round in the whole competition. After this, we played a game of Countdown in which we had a target number that we had to make out of six other numbers. I found this task difficult due to the time pressure. Then we had a round where we had six problem solving questions, of which we then had to pick six to submit. The main round involved interpreting tables to work out the squares and square roots of numbers and apply them to problems such as areas and we were not allowed any calculators.

The final round involved the most teamwork as our team of four had to split in half so we had two teams of two. The first team answered a question for which the answer could then be applied to the second team's question. At the end of the competition our school was awarded with a certificate for great teamwork. We all thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and learnt a lot of new maths skills. Thank you for taking us Mrs Mayo!

GIFTED AND TALENTED HUMANITIES TRIP

On Wednesday 22nd March Year 8 and 9 went on a gifted and talented Geography and History trip to Reigate College. It was so much fun! After Mr. Gilmore kindly drove us to Reigate College in the minibus, we followed him into a hall and sat down. In front of everyone was a quiz. Although everyone had one for themselves, we all worked as a team on our table. The six of us worked out all the questions and only got one wrong! There were questions, riddles and dingbats. It was great! Thanks to the two teachers and assistants who gave us some hints for the difficult ones. At the end of quiz we were all laughing and having a great time.

Afterwards we separated into our year groups as the Year 8s were doing History and the Year 9s, Geography. About ten of us were led down into a Geography room with name tags on so that everyone knew us. Then, to become familiar with each other, we played top trumps Geography style with information about a country on a card. Afterwards we played a trade game where each table was given a pack of resources which we had to create shapes from. Every team / country was given a laminated sheet where a shape was printed and you had to cut yours out to match it exactly. Then you took it to the teacher who was representing the world stock markets and if it fitted the model you would get money either into a bank or cash. We were given a lot of paper, some stars and money, so we had to buy things from each other. At ten minute intervals the world stock markets would change and prices would increase, lower or lose value. We played for about an hour and had a lot of fun. At the end the world stock market counted every team's scores and we won! Then we drew a line graph of how our situation changed throughout the game, talked about what we would change next time we played it to win, and discussed which country we thought we were. At the end of the session we were left thinking what rules should be set to let every country have a fair chance in the real world. Altogether it was a great experience where we got to meet new people and have fun. I'm really glad I had the opportunity to go.
