LIGHT DRAWING WORKSHOPS





Year 7 and 8 students were able to experience some of the magic of how light works, including the truth behind rainbows and the whereabouts of the pot of gold. They learnt what happens when you mix the colours and had an extended session on how to make slow motion images using a variety of LED colours and a long exposure with a digital camera, which resulted in some fantastic images and a whole new approach to photography for many of the students.









FUN WITH DRY ICE

Dry ice was placed in a cylinder of alkali with indicator solution: it turned more acidic. The colour changed from purple>blue> turquoise> green (neutral)> yellow > orange. The "smoke" was in fact carbon dioxide mist.



FRANKENSTEIN TALKS

Dr Harkup explained the science of the era that led to the British public's fascination with creating life using electricity and the publishing of Mary Shelley's Frankenstein novel.

She also spoke about the scientific breakthroughs that led to our understanding of the nervous system today and some of the workings of the brain. Dr Harkup also included some of the gruesome tales about body snatching, cages around graves and the infamous Scottish body snatchers Burke and Hare.

PANDEMIC GAMING SESSION

Students competed in teams to save the world from infectious diseases that were spreading fast, points were scored in a variety of ways such as how many diseases had been eradicated and how many cities were free of disease at the end.

COLA AND MENTOS

Ever wondered what happens if you mix bottles of coca cola with some mentos sweets?

Thousands of bubbles of carbon dioxide are made on the rough surface of each of the mentos. The pressure builds inside the bottle until the liquid is forced out.

The biggest height recorded used seven mentos and shot out a jet of spray to around 7m high!


FENCING SUCCESS FOR ETHAN AND JACOB



REIGATE BAPTIST CHURCH VISIT




