
ICELAND 2020

On Friday 14th February 39 Year 10s and 11s and four teachers embarked on a five- day trip to Iceland to give the children an insight into natural hazards, rivers and coasts which relate to a whole range of key geographical concepts they study on their GCSE Geography course.

After a flight delay the group arrived at Keflavik Airport in Reyjavik. With strong winds and heavy snow it took three hours to make the journey to the accommodation even with snow tyres.



It was an early start at 2am for the return journey to Keflavik Airport. On arrival at the airport the coach driver commented on how well behaved and polite all the children were throughout the trip.



The group were also lucky to experience a magical display of the Northern Lights.

The visit to Solheimajökull (Black Glacier) was an incredible experience. Walking over the glacier was thought provoking, especially in relation to climate change and how this might affect the glacier in years to come.

On the last evening there was a trip to the town of Grindavik to a local pizzeria where the children feasted on an unlimited pizza buffet.



Despite our plane being delayed the teachers worked really hard and managed to fit our schedule into the time we had.

We went to the Blue Lagoon on a beautiful day after having experienced two days of Icelandic sightseeing. We learnt about volcanoes and earthquakes from the past 100 years and even got to experience the 2008 earthquake in a shakehouse experience.

Luckily, our trip was finished off with getting to see the Northern Lights! We had an amazing time. Catrin.

Our children were able to meet and chat with representatives from many companies who currently offer apprenticeships. These included British Airways, Unilever, Virgin, IBM UK, Metropolitan Police Service, Bloomberg, Royal Air Force, Accenture, PGL Travel, the Army and many more.





On Wednesday 4th March, Joe Cheal from Imaginarium presented an assembly to Year

9 children, talking about his career path and what qualities and skills can make you more employable.

On Thursday 5th March it was lovely to welcome back former pupil, Zoe Smallman, who left Reigate School three years ago, and is currently on an apprenticeship programme with KPMG. She spoke about how her apprenticeship works and what opportunities this has opened up for her for her future.

During lessons this week, teachers are talking to the children about what jobs and careers their subjects relate to.

All children have been shown presentations in form time about the importance of developing transferable skills and how jobs are changing

as the world we live in changes. They have also been told how to research local market information to keep up to date with local job and work experience opportunities. One of the ways this can be done is by using Fast Tomato. This is an online career planning and information tool which all children from Year 8 onwards have access to.


It was a really successful tournament with the girls showing their attacking skills and putting into practice skills they have been working on throughout the season. Well done to all our girls in their first district netball tournament.




Mobile App

NOTIFICATION OF GAS WORKS: SLIPSHATCH ROAD - REIGATE

SGN will be completing upgrades to the gas network in Slipshatch Road, Reigate. The project involves the essential replacement of old metal gas mains with new plastic pipe to continue to provide a safe and reliable gas supply to the local area. The contractor D J Utilities (DJU) will undertake this work on behalf of SGN.



In close consultation with Surrey County Council, SGN have agreed to complete the following work, which includes traffic management in place to ensure the safety of everyone around the site:

- On the week commencing 9 March 2020 until 5 May 2020 (approximately 8 weeks), SGN will be implementing a road closure on Slipshatch Road. The closure will be from the junction of Sandcross Lane to number 81 Slipshatch Road
- A diversion will be in place via Sandcross Lane, Park Lane East, Clayhall Lane and Slipshatch Road
- Access will be maintained for residents' and businesses during the works
- Pedestrian access will always be maintained


