Finley Taylor (Year 8) said the NHS rainbow was important so he has made his amazing tragedy and comedy masks NHS themed. Superstar work well done Finley!

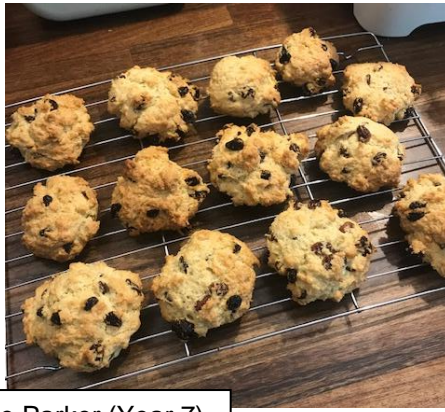


Nila Nasekhian (Year 7) made her tragedy and comedy masks with accents of gold, another amazing piece of work. Well done!

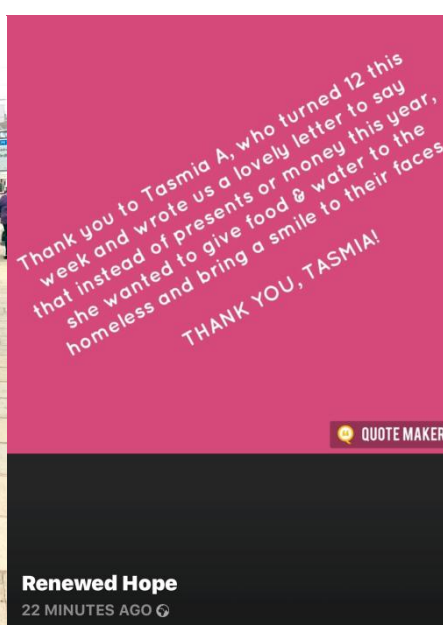


COMMUNITY SPIRIT

Every Monday, visit the Notice Board on SMHW for a Weekly Well-Being Focus.

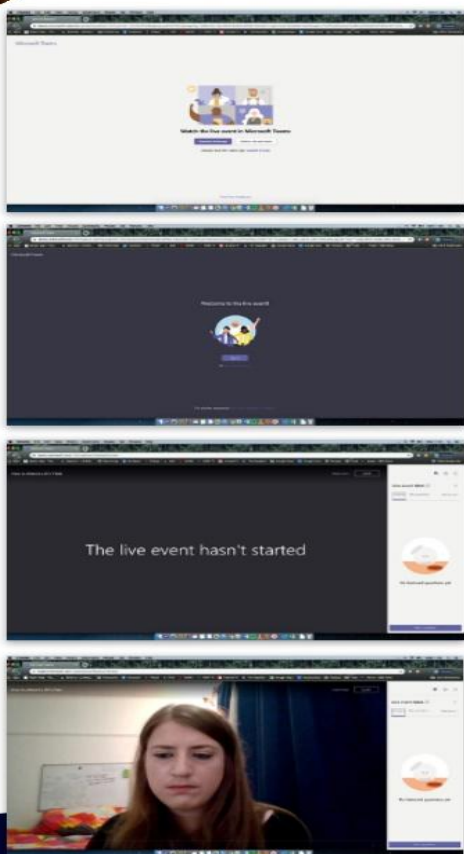

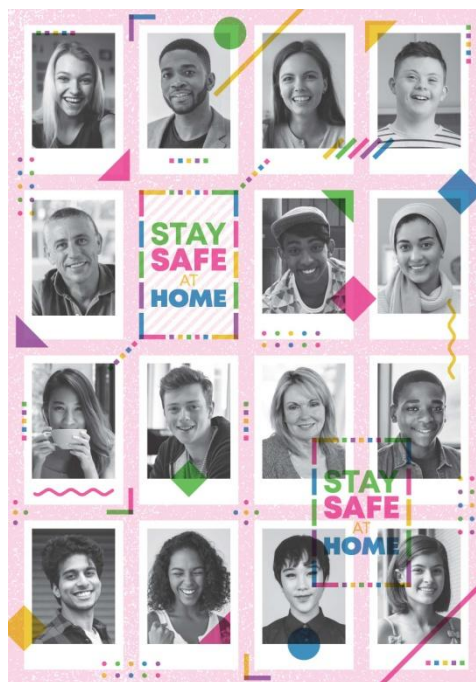
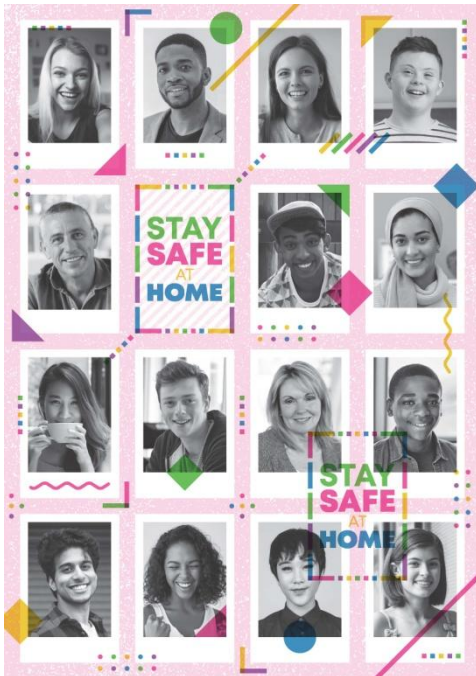
