### KIRA LIEVEN

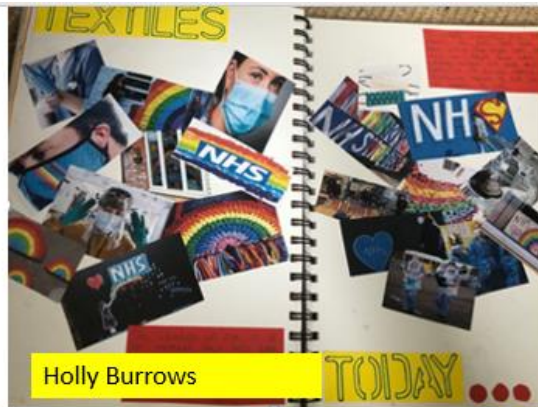

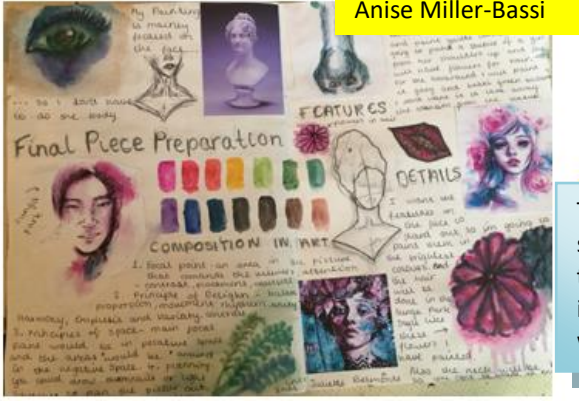
