

# JUNIOR UK MATHS CHALLENGE.

This year, the Mathematics Trust decided to go ahead with the Junior Maths Challenge, online. Altogether 80 children from Reigate School (Year 7 and Year 8) were entered. They were able to do a practice paper first and then took the challenge itself. Their results were compared with thousands of children across the UK and they were awarded Gold, Silver or Bronze certificates for scores of more than 52%. The best score in Reigate School was 87%.


