

CHILDHOOD IMMUNISATIONS

Childhood Immunisations

There are a number of immunisations that will take place in the new school year starting September 2020.

The vaccination programme is managed by Children and Family Health Surrey who provide a service for children and young people from birth up to 19 years of age.



The immunisation team ONLY use online e-consent where you can book or decline to have your child immunised at school. There are no paper consent forms and consent cannot be given over the phone to school.

Reigate School facilitates the vaccinations and they will take place in school. We will be sending out letters during the new school year that tell you how to book using the e-consent used by the Children and Family Health Immunisation team.

The following immunisations are planned to take place

October 2020: Year 8s will get their first HPV dose.

March 2021: Year 9s will get their final teenage booster*.

June 2021: Year 8s will get their second and final HPV dose

June 2021: Year 9s will have their second and final HPV dose (missed this year due to school closure)

* The teenage booster, also known as the 3-1 or the Td/IPV vaccine is given to boost protection against 3 separate diseases, tetanus, diphtheria and polio. Your child will have had vaccinations for this as a baby, aged 3 as a pre-school booster and one final vaccination in year 9. If you think you have missed any of these doses talk to your doctor or practice nurse.
