CHILD EXPLOITATION ONLINE PROTECTION (CEOP) - TIP 4

ONLINE SAFETY - DETAILS OF APPS TO HELP KEEP CHILDREN SAFE

We endeavour to keep parents and carers updated with current online safety information. With this in mind, we have included details of a couple of useful guides which have been compiled by National Online Safety. These provide details of the features of three apps which are currently popular with teens and explain about the possible associated dangers. Whilst these particular apps are not supported on the school iPad, many of our young people may have them on their mobile phone or a personal device.

WhatsApp

WhatsApp have announced that they will ban under 16s from using their service in the EU. The current minimum age for users is 13 years old. Under the new Terms and Conditions of use, WhatsApp users will be asked to confirm their age in order to proceed with using the service. Users will be required to nominate a parent or carer to give permission for them to share data. If users do not obtain permission, they will experience a less personalised version.

Snapchat

Snapchat is a photo, video and message sharing app for mobile phones and tablets. The app allows users to share images for a limited number of seconds, chat with other users and share images.

Fortnite: Battle Royale

As with many online games, Fortnite: Battle Royale comes with risks to children and young people. The game is PEGI rated at 12+ however, there is no proof of age required, which can expose younger children to violent content as well as inappropriate comments from older users. It was lovely to see the children relaxing and celebrating the hard work they have done this long term. We were proud of their mature attitude and behaviour.





When looking at the results so far it is easy to feel disappointed with three losses from four fixtures however those results were against the best three teams in our league! In every single match we have been in the game until the final minutes, with strong disciplined performances in defence. The Year 10 team does not have any stand out elite players but we don't have any weaknesses with every player able to hold their own and support the strong team ethic.

This season has seen many changes to the team. With on average 20 boys attending training on a weekly basis, we have seen a number of new players step up and claim a place in the team. Ethan Monk has claimed the goalkeeping spot with some excellent reflex saves made in a variety of 1 on 1 situations. Joel Manrow and Owen Hunt have formed an outstanding centre back partnership with Toby Marcroft stepping into the breach at left back. Cruz Sidir and Harvey Wood have been the consistent stand out players forming a strong, aggressive and combatant pairing in the centre of midfield. Zach Chant and Adam Adam have formed our new leadership team sharing the captaincy and the attacking positions. Both players have made important contributions in front of goal, keeping us in all of the close encounters we have experienced so far.

The results may not have gone our way, but the performances have been organised and strong with team spirit much advanced from what we saw last year. I am confident we will see some positive results in our remaining fixtures against Oakwood School, de Stafford School, Warlingham School and Royal Alexandra and Albert School all teams that we have beaten in the past!

THINKUKNOW



Thinkuknow is an education programme from the National Crime Agency's CEOP Command. Since 2006, Thinkuknow has been keeping children and young people safe by providing education about sexual abuse and sexual exploitation. Thinkuknow is unique. It is underpinned by the latest intelligence about child sex offending from CEOP Command. Thinkuknow aims to ensure that everyone has access to this practical information – children, young people, their parents and carers and the professionals who work with them. Alongside the Thinkuknow website the programme provides educational resources, including films, cartoons and lesson plans, to help parent/carers and professionals raise young people's awareness.

ATTENDANCE

We would like to remind all parents and children about the importance of regular school attendance. Children are expected to attend 100% of the time, be punctual every day and show good behaviour in lessons. Parents are expected to phone the absence line on every day of absence to notify the school of the reason for your child's absence.

Telephone number: 01737 245241 (Available 24 hours).

Your message should include your child's name, tutor group, reason for absence and your name.

This year, good attendance, punctuality and behaviour are being rewarded with a trip to Thorpe Park in the summer term for Years 7-10. To qualify your child must have 95 points, which is made up from 95% attendance and points awarded because of good behaviour on their reports each term. Children can also lose points for poor behaviour on their reports and for persistent lateness.

What are acceptable reasons for absence?

Some examples are vomiting, diarrhoea, high temperature, hospital appointments, and funerals.

Unacceptable reasons include:

Headache, tiredness, stomach-ache, colds, coughs, birthdays, haircuts, shopping days, duvet days! Children who have broken bones can normally be accommodated in school after discussion with Heads of Year.

Leave of absence during term time

It is highly unlikely that the Head of School will grant permission for a leave of absence during term time. These can only be considered in the most exceptional circumstances and must be applied for in advance using the absence request form available from the office. Please refer to the Attendance Policy on the school website for more information.

Will I be made aware if my child's attendance is low?

Yes, if their attendance falls below an acceptable level, a letter of concern will be sent to you and you may be asked to provide medical evidence. If there is no improvement a meeting will be arranged to discuss the situation and you may be referred to the Education Welfare Service. The Government guidelines state that if your child falls below 90% attendance they are classed as persistently absent.

YEAR 11 GCSE EXAM NOTICE

Please be aware that the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) requires <u>all Year 11 children</u> to be available until the 27th June 2019. This is because an awarding body (exam board) may need to invoke its contingency plan which would require children to go into their school up until the 27th June 2019.

In light of this, please do not book holidays that begin before the 27th June 2019 or other events that would mean your child would be unable to come into school.
