BIG BATTERY HUNT

A number of Year 7 form groups took part in this year's Big Battery Hunt, with the aim to collect and recycle as many batteries as they could in a few weeks. A few of our children have explained how they collected the batteries and why they took part.

"I collected batteries from my Aunt as she uses lots where she works. This saves the batteries from going into landfill" - Ellie

"I collected the batteries from my brother as he plays a lot of games and his batteries are constantly running out. I also collected them to protect the environment as they contain harmful chemicals" - Elsa

"I collected my batteries from my brother's old toys and I collected some from my next-door neighbour." - Mariella

"I got the batteries from the kitchen, we collect batteries for recycling and I brought those batteries to school." - Samih

"Recycling batteries will help to stop polluting and figure out a solution. "Be part of the solution, not the pollution" - Charlie

"Our form, 7AJU and the rest of the year group collected batteries to recycle. Year 7 collected around 15 full buckets. If the whole school collected this, we would have collected 75 full buckets. Imagine how many batteries that is for Reigate and Surrey, or the whole of England – That could be millions of buckets of batteries." - Alex

"Our world is dying and it is up to us to save it. We assume batteries are infinite and safe, but they aren't. We will eventually run out of metal and the chemicals inside go to landfill and pollute the soil and water systems. We collected batteries and recycled them to try and prevent pollution and save our metal resources." - Emilia

We should collect batteries because they contain chemicals and if they are not recycled, the chemicals are washed away into our water systems. We also need to re-cycle metals. Reigate School collected batteries so we can save the environment. We decided to make it in to a competition and the form that gets the most gets money for their form trip." – Sienna
