MATHS AND SCIENCE DAY OUT

On Wednesday 27th January four Year 8 and four Year 9 students went by minibus to Reigate College to participate in some activities in Maths and Science. I was lucky to be chosen to participate.

When we arrived we went to a hall with some students from other schools. First the college staff gave us some maths and science questions for us to work out and then mark.



After that we were split into the groups of students either doing maths or science. I was in the maths half. The students doing maths walked to the Maths Department of Reigate College. I worked in a group with four other students from different schools.

We were given a challenge which was to work out the greatest volume of a 5-sided box made from a piece of A4 paper. We had to cooperate to make two boxes each, all with different heights and then work out which had the greatest volume. My group worked out the box that had the greatest volume was the one which was 4cm in height.

When all the groups had finished, the teacher went through some calculations to work out the precise height. The teacher used a quadratic formula to solve this problem. Finally, she concluded the actual height was 4.1cm. This meant our answer which we had solved in a practical way was almost correct.

I found my visit to Reigate College fun and interesting. It was good to meet students from different schools and work with them. I found using a practical method to solve complex problems enjoyable.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL EVENING



27th January is the day for everyone to remember the millions of people murdered in the Holocaust, under Nazi persecution and in the subsequent genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Dafur.

On Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) we honour the survivors of these regimes and challenge ourselves to use the lessons of their experience to inform our lives today.

On 26th January the school hosted a Holocaust Memorial event in conjunction with Reigate & Banstead Council. A number of local schools and groups took part including Salfords Junior School, Dunottar Chamber Choir, Reigate Grammar School String Quartet, the Asian Social Group Choir and Orbit Shed. It was a very moving event with candles being lit by students in memory of victims of the Holocaust.





The highlight of the evening was a talk by Eve Gill, a 92 year old survivor of the Holocaust, who gave a vivid account of life in Austria at the time of the German occupation and her journey to the UK on the Kindertransport. The Mayor and Deputy Mayor were in attendance and it was a truly wonderful event.

We have received lovely feedback from people who attended and would like to thank all the students who performed and produced artwork or written work. Also a big thank you to our Head Boy, Head Girl and the prefects who give up their time to make these events go as smoothly as possible.
