MUSEUM OF LONDON

On Friday 14th June, 68 Year 9s travelled to the Museum of London, Docklands to participate in a fun day of activities. The focus was to investigate life in Whitechapel in 1888 at the time of the Jack the Ripper murders. They were able to walk through the dark and dingy re-created



streets and listen to PC Alfred Long as he recounted tales of life in this part of London. The children were also able to handle artefacts from the period to better understand life at this time. Finally, they

were able to walk around the galleries to learn about the importance of the docks in the East End for trade and during the war. An excellent day was had by all and some children especially enjoyed the period clothing!

SUCCESS AT BRAND HALL INTERNATIONAL HORSE TRIALS

During May half term Harrison in Year 11 took part in his first International 2* event at Brand Hall International Horse Trials. He was in a very tough junior section but completed a good dressage, jumped clear in the show jumping and completed a clear cross country. The cross country course was so tough there weren't many clears out of 25 children that competed. Only 14 children completed the course with a clear and there were only six clear rounds in the show jumping including Harrison's.

Harrison finished 8th overall. Unknowingly to Harrison he was being watched by the European Junior Coach and has now been invited to go on a developmental trip to Ireland in August to compete in the 2* Junior International Class representing Great Britain. He has also been picked for the South East under 18 National Championship Team again but this year doing the 2* at Frickley Park in July.

YEAR 7 AND YEAR 8 CRICKET

On Thursday 20th June a combined team of players from Year 7 and Year 8 travelled away to The Royal Alexandra and Albert School for a fixture on their picturesque cricket pitch down by the lake. Due to an issue with the minibus, initial thanks must go to the parents of the team who provided transport both to and from the fixture. Without their help the fixture would not have been able to go ahead!

We lost the toss and were sent out to bowl for the first innings. Our accurate opening pairing Ralph Cobbold and Jack Merry kept it tight for the first four overs, with very few runs leaked and the two key wickets of their opening batsman picked up. After this strong start we allowed seven other players to contribute to the bowling attack, all of which kept it tight, but Jacob Khan, James Brewis, Harry Roberts and Jack Walmsley all picked up wickets. The fielding was outstanding throughout with every single catching opportunity held and three run outs, meaning the opposition were limited to only 63 runs and bowled out before the completion of their 15 overs.

Our opening batsmen of Sam Roberts and James Brewis made a positive start to the batting innings, initially having to fend off two overs from the opposition's quick opening bowler. They were able to play more attacking strokes against their other bowlers and quickly moved onto 40 runs off just six overs. In an effort to allow more of our batsmen to contribute, I retired both openers early when they clearly could have gone on and scored more. The next four batsmen all contributed runs quickly and we reached the target of 64 runs off just eight and a half overs! A crushing victory from a very talented side.

The Year 7 boys have an important County Cup game versus Glyn School on Monday 24th June to look forward to, and the combined team will once again play against Oakwood School on Tuesday 25th June. Hopefully more victories in the bag for Reigate School. Good luck boys!

YEAR 11 GCSE EXAM NOTICE




