### FENCING FOR ENGLAND

On 17th March, Jacob (9JWI) and Ethan (9DSM) met up with the England Fencing team at Stansted Airport, to board their plane to Wroclaw in Poland, excited for the competition ahead.

Challenge Wroclaw is a famous fencing event in Europe that attracts competitors from all over the world. To be selected for the England squad, you had to be in the top 12 fencers in the country or come in the top 4 in the England Youth Championships. The competition takes place annually in the Orbita sports arena. It is a dramatic venue with over 25 pistes set up for fighting. The category Jacob and Ethan were in had 160 fencers.

Before the competition everyone warmed up and practised. The competition began with all fencers being allocated into *poules*. There were up to seven participants in each of the *poules*, who fought each other. At this stage, the competitor who was the first to score five points during their fight won. It was from these fights that we gained our rankings and entry to the Direct Elimination (DE) stage of the competition (31% of competitors are eliminated at this stage). Even if you didn't win the fight, the number of points you gained were still important in calculating both your ranking and promotion opportunity. After every fight one of the England coaches gave us a debriefing. We were given feedback on both where we fought well and areas on which to focus. All England fencers did very well, Ethan winning four fights comfortably and losing two and Jacob winning five and losing one. As a result of such successful *poules*, Jacob was seeded 23<sup>rd</sup> and Ethan 45<sup>th</sup> going into the knockout stages.

Next came the DE! To win a DE fight and advance to the next round you needed to be the first to reach 15 points. There was always support available, both from the England team and coaching staff. As the competition progressed we all got together to support our leading England teammates.

Jacob was knocked out in the first round with a score of 12-15, but Ethan won his first DE 15-12. Ethan then unfortunately came up against another GBR fencer and lost 11-15.

Overall Ethan and Jacob finished 47th and 65th respectively out of 160 competitors. Everyone had a great time. We met lots of new people and learnt so much in our first overseas competition. We look forward to entering the competition again next year and hopefully other international events in the future.

ARTS AWARD SUCCESS



Reigate School's Performing Arts department is pleased to announce a 100% pass rate after the Arts Award moderation!

Every student in year 7 and 8 does a project as part of their Performing Arts independent study. These projects focus on:

- Creating a project on their Arts' inspiration (Year 7)
- Evidencing their participation in a Performing Arts activity (either the Dance, Drama and Music they do in school or any Performing Arts they do outside of school) (Year 8)
- Reviewing a piece of Performing Arts that they have seen (during lessons or at a theatre/cinema/gallery in their own time - Year 8)
- Passing on a Performing Arts skill (Year 8)

If the quality of all of the above tasks is of an excellent standard and evidenced well then we can consider entering those individual projects for Arts Award. Equally, each year we have students whose projects aren't quite at the Arts Award standard but put in huge amounts of additional time and effort to improve them until they are - which is a real testimony to the work ethic of so many of the Reigate School students. The Performing Arts department mark all students' projects and all students are made aware of the likelihood of them passing Bronze Arts award – which they are entered for during Year 9.

Last year was our first year entering students for this award. Twenty six students were entered and all 26 passed. This year we had almost double the amount of students entered and are proud to have maintained our 100% pass rate.

Our feedback from the moderator was very positive and we hope that entry to Arts Award is something that will continue to grow with each year. The current Year 8s' independent study is due in the week after Summer half term and we look forward to seeing the wonderful work produced – hopefully entering many of these students next academic year.

Well done to all of our Year 9 students who passed Bronze Arts Award this year!
