BLUE WHALE CHALLENGE

There have been numerous media reports recently about the Blue Whale 'suicide game'. While extremely concerning the story is actually 'fake news', as explained by the Safer Internet Centre. However, we should still remain alert to signs of self-harm and suicidal feelings for all of our students which will continue to exist outside the context of the Blue Whale.

There can be a danger that if we focus on one specific case such as this or the 'Cut for Zain' campaign that circulated when Zain left One Direction, we can miss the behavioural and physical signs and symptoms that our students display outside of these times. However, concerns about the phenomenon by parents and/or students may be a useful opportunity to start an open discussion about the subject.
