Increased attainment and progress in English & Maths for children who were performing lower than expected in KS2.

Year 7 Enhanced English Additional English & Literacy lessons are provided for selected children based on data from KS2 assessments. This amounts to 3 lessons per fortnight per group in a small group session. Sessions are delivered by Intervention Tutors, using specific schemes of work tailored to literacy. The Enhanced Learning group further supports mastery learning by continually revisiting key content and skills until they are mastered, which the EEF identify as having an impact of +5 months on a child's progress. Children who attended school regularly made excellent progress in exit tests and 39% of children were predicted a Grade 4 in English by the end of the academic year. Furthermore, 78% of children demonstrated an accelerated improvement in their reading age over the course of the year, with 22% making an improvement of over 2 years. Enhanced English will continue in 2019-2020; however, a new programme will be followed called the Hackney LIT programme to improve outcomes even further.

Sessions are delivered by Maths teachers, using specific schemes of work tailored to key Maths skills.
