





After an inspiring half time talk from coach Mr Strachan, Reigate got their act together and scored six goals to gain the win. The scorers were Zachary Chant, Miles Greenfield, Connor Patterson, Oliver Mooney, Adam Adam and an own goal that came off Onnen Denman-Tanner. The defence was rock solid and Reigate played an amazing first game. Man of the match was Oliver Mooney.

For the second game of the season we travelled away to play at St Bede's School. It was Monday 12th October and not only a league game but also a cup game. If Reigate won this, they would advance to the semi-finals. The game started slowly but later Zachary Chant broke through and put Reigate 1-0 ahead.
