


Activity Instructions


Task: GEOGRAPHY


Task HISTORY



This video explores the struggle for women's right to vote in the early 20th century. It discusses the differences between the peaceful Suffragists and the more militant Suffragettes, highlighting their campaigns, challenges and eventual success in achieving voting rights for women.


Task GEOGRAPHY

- Wildlife




Task ART


