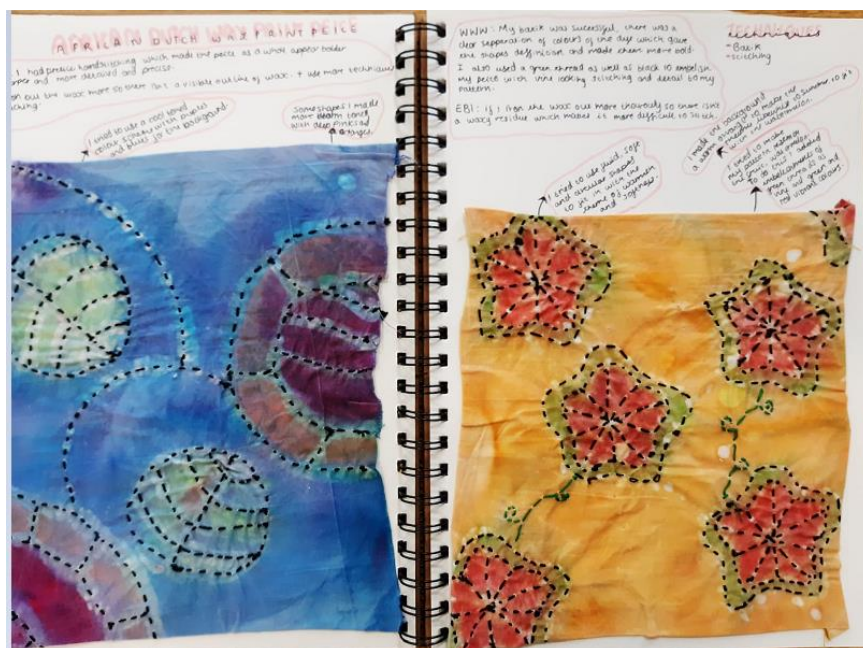

## PSHE LIFE SKILLS WORKSHOP

Last Friday, Year 11s showed great maturity as they attended workshops on '**Knowing and understanding the body**'. It was great to see such positive feedback from so many children:

- **113** children responded to the survey
- **104/113** found the workshops useful
- **38%** would like future workshops to be mixed biological classes
- **94/113** found the material relevant to their lives
- **97/113** felt they learned things that they didn't know before the workshops
- **11** children have volunteered to talk to younger children about the workshop content in the future

*"I found out a lot of things about both females and males that I did not know before and it helped me believe in myself and realise that everyone is amazing in their own way. The workshops made me think that I don't have to be insecure and that I'm good enough as myself. We took part in a lot of discussion so therefore I got to contribute and ask questions. Overall, it was a very good workshop and it was very beneficial to me and others – it should be carried on!" - Chloe Year 11*

### PARTNER SCHOOL ADMISSIONS 2021/22

East Surrey College and Reigate College are pleased to announce that for September 2021 applicants there will be one online application process for their Partner Schools – De Stafford School, Oakwood School, Reigate School and The Warwick School. This is for all full-time courses and apprenticeships.

Your son or daughter will receive information through their school in September 2020 which will enable them to apply to both Colleges online, whilst only filling in one application form which will be submitted to the relevant College(s). The Colleges will then request one reference from the school and arrange interview dates at one or both Colleges so that the pupils will be in a position to make a decision on which College to attend by January 2021.

The rationale for the one online application process is to make it easier for your son or daughter to apply to one or both Colleges on one online form without having to replicate information. It also allows the Colleges and schools to fulfil their legal obligations of tracking students to ensure all students are engaged in either education or work with training up to the age of 18.

The Colleges are looking forward to working with you and hope that the transition from school to College will be a smooth one. If you or your son or daughter have any queries about transition to College at 16+, please contact your Head of Year or Careers Advisor at school.

## Important dates

### 1 September 2020

You can apply online for a school place.

### 23 October 2020

We suggest you submit your secondary application by this date as this is the Friday before the half term holiday.

### 31 October 2020

Closing date for secondary applications but we welcome early applications.

### 1 March 2021

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for **ParentComms**, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.

### By 15 March 2021

You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

### By 29 March 2021

If you wish to appeal for a community school listed on your form, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 16 June 2021. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

## Is your child in year 6?

If your child was born between 1 September 2009 and 31 August 2010 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by **31 October 2020**.

## How do I apply?

- The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online. Visit [surreycc.gov.uk/admissions](https://surreycc.gov.uk/admissions) to access the application form and more information on the application process and admission arrangements for Surrey schools. It is important that you consider this information carefully when you make your application.
- You can start your online application any time from 1 September 2020 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2020. This is during the half term holiday so we would suggest you submit your application by Friday **23 October 2020**.
- You can download the app **ParentComms** to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.
- Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.
- On **1 March 2021** you will receive an email with the outcome of your application and, if you have registered for **ParentComms**, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.
- You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by **15 March 2021**.

## What else do I need to know?

- School open days will usually be held in September or October. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings.
- You can name up to six schools on your application form, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools.
- Schools will not know where you have ranked them on the application form so the order of your preferences does not disadvantage you.
- The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools.
- If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.
- If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them.
- If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.
- Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in addition to the application form. Find out more about supplementary information forms at [surreycc.gov.uk/admissions](https://surreycc.gov.uk/admissions).
- If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough or district and the council tax account number for the property where your child normally lives. Otherwise you will be asked to provide evidence of where your child lives.
- When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receive a confirmation email which sets out your preferences and confirms your application reference number.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email you should check your application to ensure its status has been changed to 'submitted'.
- If you write to us or submit information to support an application, remember to include your child's name, date of birth and application reference number (if you applied online).
- If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.



# BE BRIGHT & BE SEEN

this winter



Now that the clocks have gone back and it's getting darker earlier on, it's more important than ever to make sure you can be seen when you're out and about near roads.

There are loads of ways to be seen and stay safer  
- so check over the page for some top tips!

## 5 top tips on how to BE BRIGHT & BE SEEN

- 1** Brightly coloured or fluorescent clothing shows up well in daylight and at dusk when you're heading to and from school.
- 2** If you're out and about when it's dark, wear reflective gear to make sure you can be seen in car headlights. Reflective vests, sashes or wristbands work well. Remember, fluorescent clothing doesn't work after dark!
- 3** Don't forget to accessorise! Even small items such as clip-on reflectors, armbands and stickers on your outfit or school bag are a great way to improve your visibility.
- 4** If you like to cycle, remember that it's the law to have clean and working lights at night (white at the front, red at the back), as well as a rear reflector. It's good to fit spoke reflectors too.
- 5** Of course, 'Being Bright' isn't the only way to stay safer. If you're out at night, choose routes and crossing places that are well lit and remember to always use the Green Cross Code.

# Get into Teaching Virtual Information Seminars

Reigate & Banstead Borough Council is proposing to build a crematorium and memorial garden in the borough to provide a much-needed local service for bereaved families.

We are writing to advise you that our chosen site is in Woodhatch, located off the Woodhatch Road between Lonesome Lane Recreation Ground and New Pond Farm allotments. We are currently developing plans for a discreet, modern, low profile crematorium, surrounded by an attractively landscaped garden of remembrance

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We have looked at various locations and our feasibility studies showed the Woodhatch site to be the most suitable. Its semi-rural location offers a tranquil, quiet and accessible space to enable an appropriate experience for mourners, while seeking to minimise the impact on neighbours.

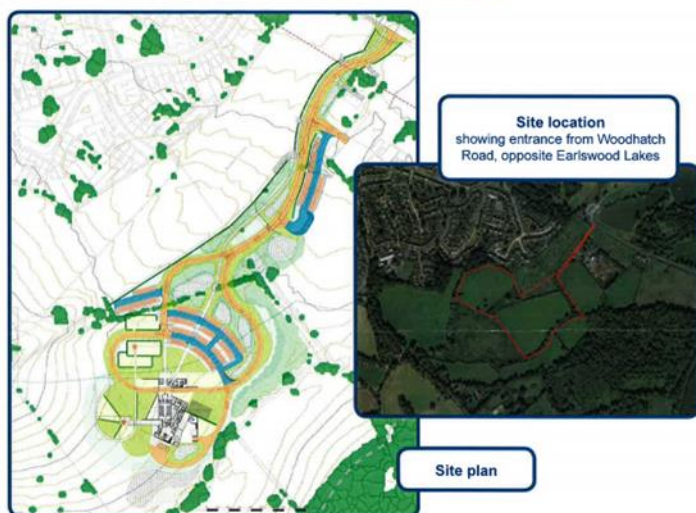
Please be assured that the design will take account of stringent environmental safeguards, provide appropriate levels of car parking space and include arrangements to manage traffic from visitors to the site. Making sure the design of the building and site is environmentally friendly will also be fundamental to our proposals.

### Local need

Research undertaken on behalf of the Council last year showed that there was a clear need for a facility in the borough. Currently, Reigate & Banstead residents who wish their loved ones to be cremated must journey to a facility out of the borough, usually to Leatherhead, Crawley, Croydon or Merton. The lack of local provision means that bereaved families can experience a long wait for services, as well as difficulties finding a convenient time, due to the demand at those facilities, at what is an already upsetting time.

## Reigate & Banstead crematorium proposal

The following shows the proposed location and layout of the Council's proposed crematorium facility.



### Managing the crematorium

The Council plans to deliver and manage the facility itself so we have greater control over its design and running, including service quality, timings and management of the site. Our intention is to offer services that are appropriately staggered to ensure we can allow more time for mourners to pay their respects. This will also be used to manage traffic movement to and from the site.
