Drop Down Workshops

Year 11 children will attend RSE and careers workshops* as part of a Drop Down morning from their usual lessons; Year 11 parents and carers will have received an email regarding this. These workshops will be tailored to the needs of all children and in line with Government guidance. Resources and workshop discussions will be age and developmentally appropriate

Friday, 27th November: Drop Down morning 2:

Year 11 children are to arrive at school as normal for workshops throughout Lessons 1, 2 and 3. After lunch, lessons 4 and 5 will resume as normal

9:00 - 10:50	<p>RSE Education: Led virtually by Amelia Jenkinson - Co-Founder & CEO, School of Sexuality Education</p> <p><u>Focus 1: Consent & digital</u> What is 'consent'? The law & ethics around consent, including personal boundaries and how it's our responsibility to seek consent. Myths and misconceptions around consent. How "real-life" consent might compare to what we see in mainstream pornography. Verbal and non-verbal signs that someone is consenting. Applying consent to digital scenarios: sexting, image-sharing and online sexual harassment. Digital defence skills: e-safety tools to support you if you experience harmful behaviour online.</p> <p><u>Focus 2: Positive relationships</u> Introducing framework for understanding positive relationships (consideration, equality, trust and honesty). Analysing scenarios showing an unhealthy teen relationship - identifying negative/abusive relationship behaviours. Exploring conflict resolution in relationships and positive discussion. Break-ups and positive break-ups. Seeking support.</p>
11:30 - 12:25	<p>Careers:</p> <p>Following on from the careers session in the first half term, Year 11s will now turn to researching careers that are of interest to them. They will discuss some key considerations when making a career choice and will then use Fast Tomato, a web-based app designed to help young people broaden their horizons and consider a broader spectrum of career and education options. Year 11s will take a short psychometric questionnaire which gauges interests, attitudes and motivations. They are then offered career and education suggestions, personalised to them.</p>

After the workshops, children will be given the opportunity to provide anonymous feedback so that we can tailor their next workshop in the year accordingly.

PARTNER SCHOOL ADMISSIONS 2021/22

East Surrey College and Reigate College are pleased to announce that for September 2021 applicants there will be one online application process for their Partner Schools – De Stafford School, Oakwood School, Reigate School and The Warwick School. This is for all full-time courses and apprenticeships.

Your son or daughter will receive information through their school in September 2020 which will enable them to apply to both Colleges online, whilst only filling in one application form which will be submitted to the relevant College(s). The Colleges will then request one reference from the school and arrange interview dates at one or both Colleges so that the pupils will be in a position to make a decision on which College to attend by January 2021.

The rationale for the one online application process is to make it easier for your son or daughter to apply to one or both Colleges on one online form without having to replicate information. It also allows the Colleges and schools to fulfil their legal obligations of tracking students to ensure all students are engaged in either education or work with training up to the age of 18.

The Colleges are looking forward to working with you and hope that the transition from school to College will be a smooth one. If you or your son or daughter have any queries about transition to College at 16+, please contact your Head of Year or Careers Advisor at school.
