VIRTUAL CROSS COUNTRY EVENT 2021

SUNDAY 7TH FEB — MONDAY 15TH FEB

In the immediate absence of school and district cross country events this season, we are encouraging all secondary school aged students in Surrey to take on the challenge of completing a virtual cross country run. Whether you are new to running or have represented the county previously, this event is open to all and free! Within the Surrey Schools' Athletic Association we want to be setting an example of safe mass participation and physical activity involvement during lockdown.

Distances

Year 7 Girls - 3.2km
 Year 7 Boys - 3.2km
 Year 8 & 9 Girls - 3.6km
 Year 8 & 9 Boys - 4.1km
 Year 10 & 11 Girls - 4.1km
 Year 12 & 13 Girls - 4.1km
 Year 10 & 11 Boys - 5.8km
 Year 12 & 13 Boys - 7.2km

Rules

1. The run time must be validated with a link to a GPS activity file, entered in the final question on this questionnaire. Examples of free iOS/Android apps include Strava, RunKeeper, Adidas Running, Pacer and MapMyRun)
2. Make sure you run the correct distance for your relative age (see the table above)
3. Your run must not be net downhill. Your start and finish elevation must be the same, or finishing at a higher elevation.
4. Students are only allowed one submission. But you are welcome to have a number of attempts within the window of time, but please only submit your best effort with the relevant activity file.
5. Please follow the government's guidance on social distancing and exercising outdoors.
6. This is a cross country event, so please complete the run on appropriate terrain.

MICROSOFT TEAMS



- Please may you help to ensure that your child's Teams is switched to available to learn. This can be seen by the following green tick  next to their initial badge in the top right corner.
- The children should assume that all lessons are live UNLESS they have prior notice from a teacher via Show My Homework. Even if they don't see a Teams invite on their schedule they should be up ready at the PC and on office 365. This means that if there has been any issue with a child not being invited prior to that day the teacher can see they are not online and invite them then and there at the start of a lesson.
- The children should check they are refreshing their calendars – if there is no invite, refresh the calendar and try again!

PARTNER SCHOOL ADMISSIONS 2021/22

East Surrey College and Reigate College are pleased to announce that for September 2021 applicants there will be one online application process for their Partner Schools – De Stafford School, Oakwood School, Reigate School and The Warwick School. This is for all full-time courses and apprenticeships.

Your son or daughter will receive information through their school in September 2020 which will enable them to apply to both Colleges online, whilst only filling in one application form which will be submitted to the relevant College(s). The Colleges will then request one reference from the school and arrange interview dates at one or both Colleges so that the pupils will be in a position to make a decision on which College to attend by January 2021.

The rationale for the one online application process is to make it easier for your son or daughter to apply to one or both Colleges on one online form without having to replicate information. It also allows the Colleges and schools to fulfil their legal obligations of tracking students to ensure all students are engaged in either education or work with training up to the age of 18.

The Colleges are looking forward to working with you and hope that the transition from school to College will be a smooth one. If you or your son or daughter have any queries about transition to College at 16+, please contact your Head of Year or Careers Advisor at school.
