YEAR 9 COUNTY CUP CRICKET

On a momentous day for Reigate School, we took our first sports fixture against another school for nearly 18 months! I took a talented group of Year 9 cricketers for a County Cup fixture versus Riddlesdown School. With uncertain weather predicted, the captain James won the toss and chose to bowl first on what was a lively artificial wicket.

Our brisk opening bowling pair of James and Harry put the opposition under immediate pressure picking up a wicket each in the early overs. Our first and second change bowlers of Ralph, Gareth and Luke continued this strong position picking up key wickets. Matt helped finish off the tail with Gareth (our overseas signing who claimed 3 wickets on his debut), limiting the opposition to only 74 runs all out. The most impressive thing about this performance was the all round fielding display, we had five catching opportunities, some very tricky ones, all of which were taken. This rarely happens in cricket at this level, top stuff lads! Henry gave a classy performance behind the stumps, but



particular mention should go to Sam, Momen and Dan, all of which contributed selflessly in the field without demanding the opportunity to bowl.

The Reigate School innings began with some attacking shots from James and Luke, racing to 17 runs off 3 overs. However, both fell in quick succession putting some brief pressure on our batting line up on what was a tricky wicket to bat on. Thankfully Jack and Harry asserted their authority immediately and settled the ship. They quickly led us to the winning target of 75 runs off just 13 overs. Jack scored 18 not out (including a huge six!) whilst Harry reached 14 not out, both boys showing a solid technique and an ability to hit the ball to all areas of the pitch. I am confident this team can progress to the latter stages of this tournament and have a really good chance of winning it, something which has only been done once before by Reigate School. PSHE DROP DOWN WORKSHOPS

Our brand new, comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme, that launched in September, has been received positively by many children across all year groups and the dedicated team of Lifeskills staff delivering this bespoke provision.

To ensure our children receive a broad and balanced curriculum additional workshops are scheduled, for a full day this year, to supplement some key topic areas to include: drugs and alcohol, extremism, gang/knife crime and relationships and sex education (RSE*). These workshops will be in line with Government guidance, led by experienced, credible, external speakers and tailored to the needs of all children. Resources and workshop discussions will be age and developmentally appropriate. Workshops are planned to be delivered in person but if government restrictions don't allow for this, the sessions will go ahead remotely through a live presentation.

Prior to the workshops, the speakers leading them will host a parent webinar for you to join where you will learn more about the content of each workshop and have the opportunity to ask any questions. **We will send webinar sign-up details nearer the time.**

SURREY ADULT LEARNING

We would like to invite parents and carers of Year 7 to a drug and alcohol awareness workshop delivered online by drug education charity the **Daniel Spargo-Mabbs** Foundation funded by **Surrey Adult Learning.**

This will be held on Tuesday 8th June 2021 from 6.30 – 8pm and led by the Director and Founder of the charity, Fiona Spargo-Mabbs and our drugs educators.

The world for young people is a very different place than it was for their parents, including their vulnerability to risk from drugs and alcohol, and this workshop provides a great opportunity for you as a parent or carer to become more aware of what issues face your children, and what you can do to help them stay safe.

The workshop will involve finding out about:

- levels of young people's exposure to drugs and alcohol what, where, when and how
- what young people, and their parents and carers, need to know about the risks of drugs and alcohol
- factors that affect young people's decisions about drugs and alcohol, including teenage brain development
- how to have effective conversations with your child, and practical suggestions for what you can do to support them to stay safe
- where to go for more information and support.

The DSM Foundation was set up by Fiona and Tim Spargo-Mabbs in 2014 after the tragic death of their 16-year-old son Daniel as a result of taking ecstasy (www.dsmfoundation.org.uk). The aim of the charity is to support young people to make safe choices about drugs, and they work with students, teachers, parents/carers and professionals in schools, colleges and community organisations across the UK.

Fiona has become a leading UK expert on drug education, including how parents can best support their children. She has spoken to parents and carers across the UK and internationally. She is also regularly asked to speak by the media, and you can see her on ITV's This Morning about what parents and carers can do to support their children to make safe choices here - https://www.itv.com/thismorning/hot-topics/ecstasy-epidemic-what-to-tell-your-children

MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS LINE

New Mental Health Crisis Line

A new 24/7 mental health crisis line for children, young people and their families and carers in Surrey has launched.



The freephone number - **0800 915 4644** – is available for children and young people up to the age of 18, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND).

The new crisis line provides emotional wellbeing support, advice, and signposting to a range of community services for children, young people and their families and carers who are in a mental health crisis. The number is available to those who are already receiving mental health services, and also for those who are not. No referral is needed.

The crisis line is staffed by a team of experienced, trained call handlers and mental health nurses.

A key aim of the crisis line is to help support young people, carers and families within their own homes and in the community and, whenever possible, help avoid the need for children and young people to go to hospital in a crisis.



Developing Positive Behaviour through Emotion coaching:

An approach for parents and carers to use with children and young people (aged 3-18 years).



Sound familiar?

Tim, 4, has made it clear he doesn't want to get ready for bed and his loud screams wake up his baby sister.

Marta, 9, refuses to get up out of bed and prepare for school in the morning. When her Dad pulls off the covers, she hurts him.

Sam, 15, won't stop playing on the iPad. He promised his sister he would share it with her, and so a loud argument starts. Someone gets hurt.

Emotion coaching is an approach which helps children and young people to understand the different emotions they experience, why they occur and how to handle them. This helps children and young people to learn how to regulate their emotions and behaviour.



- Emotion coaching training is a <u>free</u>, online course for <u>parents and carers</u>.
- There are two training options to choose from:

Option A: Introductory Course: An introduction to emotion coaching, one-off, 2-hour session on 19th May 2021 at either: 12.30pm-2pm or 6.30pm-8.30pm.

Option B: Applied Course: A more in-depth look at what emotion coaching is and how to use it effectively with your child, including 5x 1.5 hour sessions with a mix of training, reflection and discussion. Course dates: 6th, 13th, 20th, 27th May and 10th June 2021 at 12.30pm-2pm.
