YEAR 9 COUNTY CUP CRICKET

With a number of schools having to withdraw from this year's competition, Reigate School were drawn against Wallington Boy's Grammar School in a quarter-final on Monday 5th July.

Having won the toss, our captain James Brewis chose to bat on what looked a good wicket. Immediately James and the other opening batsman Gareth Glover made an attacking start scoring numerous boundaries on our way to 24 runs off the first three overs. After losing Gareth, Luke Hirchfield came in and steadied the ship, fending off the opening bowlers and then two talented spinners in the middle overs. We rotated the strike well allowing James to play some more attacking strokes. Luke was out for 13 but had fended off some excellent bowling. The middle order helped support James to a career high score of 64, including two sixes. This was particularly impressive as the bowling attack was disciplined throughout giving away only two extras and limiting our score to 104 off 20 overs, competitive but certainly within range for the opposition.

Our pacy opening bowlers of Harry Roberts and James Brewis started strongly picking up crucial early wickets and limiting the run rate. However, the opposition had one



opening batsman who was clearly very talented with a strong technique. Gareth Glover clean bowled him with his very first ball which then opened up the middle order to the talents of our spin attack. Luke Hirchfield picked up three wickets, whilst Jack Walmsley impressed with two of the best overs of leg spin I have seen with numerous unplayable deliveries. The opposition were strong and batted all the way down to 11, however we also bowled tight with very few extras offered up and all our catches held. Wallington needed 20 runs off the last over, but fell some way short, resulting in an impressive victory for Reigate against a disciplined side from Wallington. This result means we qualify for the semi-finals against Hinchley Wood, who unfortunately have had to withdraw due to a Covid outbreak in Year 9 and the whole year group have needed to isolate. Reigate School are therefore through to the final against Weydon School, scheduled to be played on Monday 12th July at Leigh Cricket Club. Fingers crossed we can bring home the silverware to end what has been a testing year!


YEAR 7 ENGLISH

MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS LINE

New Mental Health Crisis Line

A new 24/7 mental health crisis line for children, young people and their families and carers in Surrey has launched.



The freephone number - **0800 915 4644** – is available for children and young people up to the age of 18, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND).

The new crisis line provides emotional wellbeing support, advice, and signposting to a range of community services for children, young people and their families and carers who are in a mental health crisis. The number is available to those who are already receiving mental health services, and also for those who are not. No referral is needed.

The crisis line is staffed by a team of experienced, trained call handlers and mental health nurses.

A key aim of the crisis line is to help support young people, carers and families within their own homes and in the community and, whenever possible, help avoid the need for children and young people to go to hospital in a crisis.


