SCHOOL MORNING PROCEDURE

Thank you to all parents and carers for their continued efforts to help support their children to arrive at school on time.

All children need to be in school, in their tutor classroom by 8.45am. The morning register (a legal requirement) is then taken promptly each morning. This is a key part of school safeguarding procedures. We need to know all children have arrived safely in school each day.

Children who arrive after 8.45am are marked late and asked to attend a daily lunchtime detention. Their time in detention is flexible as we understand sometimes there are non-avoidable situations that lead to a child being late.

Children who do not turn up to these daily detentions or are consistently late in the morning or to lessons throughout the week will be asked to attend an after school detention on a Monday afternoon.

All the children at school know about the importance of arriving on time and attending classes on time. Tutor time is not only when key school announcements are made and letters are handed out but where discussions can take place, friendships made and the children and their tutor get to know each other and can discuss any issues they may have.

Being on time and ready to learn demonstrates respect for others and their time, one of our key school values. Research shows that children who are regularly late can never recover certain essential parts of their school day such as settling down to get ready to learn. It is also proven that attendance and punctuality are the most important factors in a child's success.

The new crisis line provides emotional wellbeing support, advice, and signposting to a range of community services for children, young people and their families and carers who are in a mental health crisis. The number is available to those who are already receiving mental health services, and also for those who are not. No referral is needed.

The crisis line is staffed by a team of experienced, trained call handlers and mental health nurses. A key aim of the crisis line is to help support young people, carers and families within their own homes and in the community and, whenever possible, help avoid the need for children and young people to go to hospital in a crisis.
