














YEAR 8 FOOTBALL

On Monday 4th October the Year 11 Reigate School football team played Glenthorne High School in the English Schools National Cup second round. Reigate took an early lead thanks to Head Boy Henry with a neat finish from close range. Glenthorne were playing well but the Reigate defensive line held firm with Jack making some crucial interceptions to keep us in the lead. However, 10 minutes before half time Glenthorne equalised through a defensive error, a lofted back pass by Callan bounced over Sam's head and into the net. The end of the first half saw both teams create chances, Archie saw a low long range effort tipped round the post while Sam commanded his box well making some good saves to keep the game at 1-1.



Glenthorne got the second half underway with both teams giving away fouls. Reigate were playing some excellent football and looked to be dominating. The freephone number - 0800 915 4644 - is available for children and young people up to the age of 18, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND).

The new crisis line provides emotional wellbeing support, advice, and signposting to a range of community services for children, young people and their families and carers who are in a mental health crisis. The number is available to those who are already receiving mental health services, and also for those who are not. No referral is needed.

The crisis line is staffed by a team of experienced, trained call handlers and mental health nurses.

A key aim of the crisis line is to help support young people, carers and families within their own homes and in the community and, whenever possible, help avoid the need for children and young people to go to hospital in a crisis.
