



SPORTS TOUR BARCELONA

During the first week of the Easter holidays 39 children from Year 10 and 11 went to Spain on a sports tour. After arriving at Gatwick Airport at 5am there was a buzz from everyone of excitement and anticipation of what the week will bring us.

When we arrived in Barcelona we were whisked away to the Nou Camp for a tour of the stadium. Walking around the stadium the children were able to see



all of the trophies that Barcelona has won across the clubs history. There were also cases of golden boots and Ballon D'Or balls which have been gifted to the club to show off to members of the public. The children were able to go into the away changing rooms but due to games being played during the week at the Nou Camp we couldn't get into the home changing rooms. However, when the children were able to get out into the stands to see the pitch and the number of seats

they were blown away by the size of it. The children were able to sit in the dug outs and a few were lucky enough to be given some grass off of the pitch as a keep sake of their trip. After we finished the tour around the Nou Camp we drove an hour and a half to get to the hotel, checked in and down to the beach.



During the week there was both football and netball training with different coaches. The boys were trained by Espanol coaches whilst the girls were trained by an ex Wales and Superleague netball franchise Bath coach, now at Surrey Storm netball. The coaching continued to develop what the children had learnt at school during the season.

On Wednesday afternoon the netball girls went off to play a competitive match against the International School of Barcelona. The game was split into 6x10 minutes with a constant rotational squad to allow everyone to have the opportunity to put into practice what they had completed in their training sessions on Tuesday and Wednesday morning. The game was tough and with a rotational squad it wasn't always easy to maintain the lead we had accumulated in the first quarter. The girls from the International School ranged from Year 9s all through until Year 13 and therefore it needed Reigate to raise our game to come away with the win. The final score was 29-27 with a nail biter of a final quarter.




good advice about the industry and about performing skills. We learnt to say "Hey you, get out of here!" in a New York accent. Spiros and Holly were absolute stars and read


Sister Act Rehearsal News
