PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION - YEAR 7

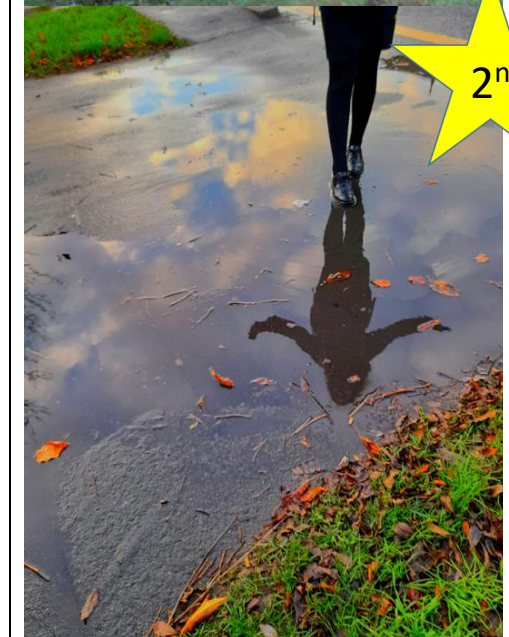

YEAR 9 AND YEAR 10 DISTRICT SPORTS

On Thursday 12th May the Year 9 and 10 Athletics squad went to K2 leisure centre in Crawley to compete in the District Sports competition. Due to COVID restrictions this was the first time this event has been able to run since 2019! The athletes were excellent on the day and positively represented Reigate School. The intermediate boys team finished in an impressive 4th position and the junior boys team finished 5th! As a school we finished 7th overall out of 15 teams.


