


## PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION - YEAR 7


























## NATIONAL PLAYWRITING COMPETITION



Each year, Reigate School takes on a number of *trainee teachers* to complete their placements. The main provider of these is the excellent i2i Teaching Partnership SCITT. i2i is based out of Weydon School in Farnham, with training hubs at Weydon School and Reigate School, and trains over 50 teachers across all curriculum subjects.

If you, or someone you know, is thinking about teaching but are perhaps not sure if it is the right career for you, the best thing you can do is to come into school, meet the teachers, trainees and students, observe some lessons and get a feel for school life.
