# **ACTIVE SURREY GYMNASTICS**



On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> May seven Year 8s were taken to Leatherhead and Dorking Gymnastics Club to attend an event run through Active Surrey in celebration of the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham this summer.

The children had a talk from a coach at the gymnastics club who has been to the Commonwealth Games three times, followed by a demonstration from a GB gymnast who showed off her skills on the asymmetric bars.

After that the children were given nearly an hour and a half to try lots of different equipment including the rings, parallel bars, beam, climbing ropes, trampolines, asymmetric bars, floor and the tumble run.



Three of our children showed the Commonwealth values of honesty, respect and determination and were given a gold medal for their effort throughout the afternoon. A special mention must go to Natasha who was given the determination award as she struggled to complete some of the tasks at the beginning but persevered, showed resilience and gave everything a go. She didn't stop trying and listened to all the feedback the coaches gave to her. By the end of the afternoon it was hard to get her off of the equipment as she wanted to keep having a go as she was enjoying herself so much. True Reigate School and Commonwealth values shown so well done!

We hope that the children had a great time and it inspired them to continue doing some physical gymnastic activities beyond this fantastic experience.


