NEWQUAY TRIP 2022

During half term, we had the pleasure of taking 63 Year 8s to Newquay for the annual watersports trip. After a very smooth trip down to Cornwall we kick started the activities with some Body Boarding and Surfing on Fistral Beach. The sun shone all afternoon and after an early start you would have thought that the children would have welcomed an early night!! I think the adrenaline of the day and excitement for some who had not been away from home before kicked in and they finally fell asleep at around 10pm.

A 7.30am knock on the door woke the children to another beautiful day, this time to Porthtowan Beach that was about an hour away. The sea was great for Body Boarding as the waves were 'messy', however this proved much trickier when trying to stand up on a surfboard.
