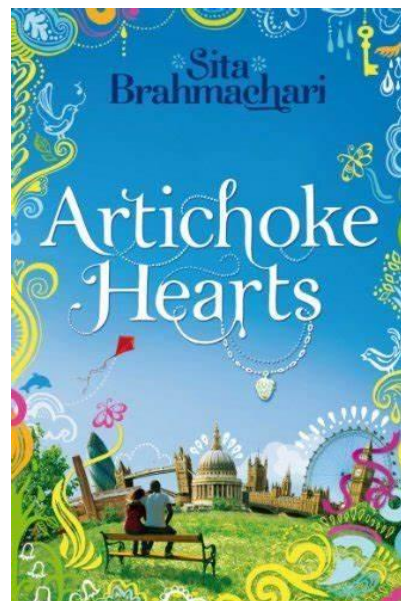
## SUGGESTED READS

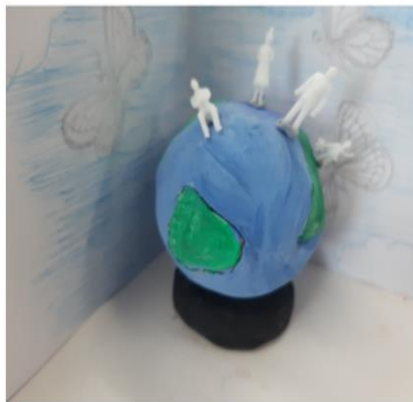
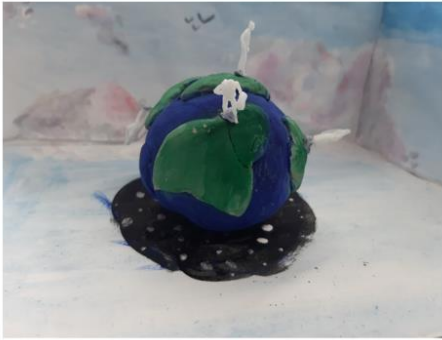
### JOSHUA ANDERSON

The children in Year 8 have been having fun creating clay responses to Pop Art. This set of work by 8TA shows some very creative thinking- well done year eight!





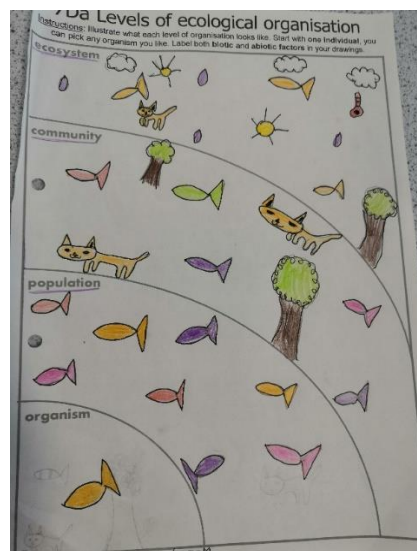
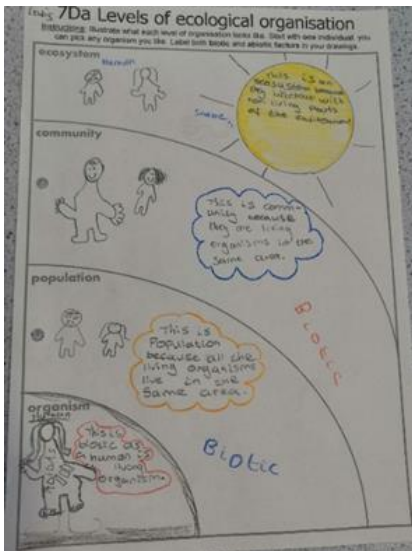
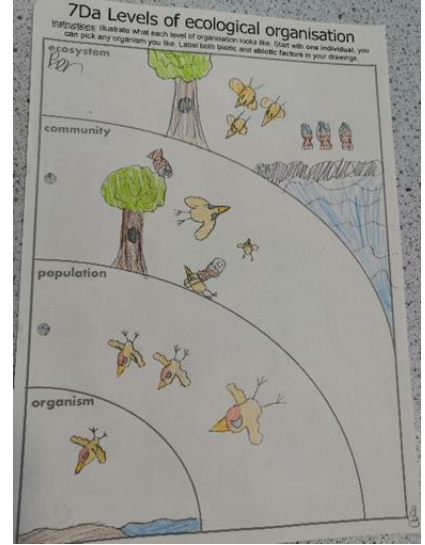
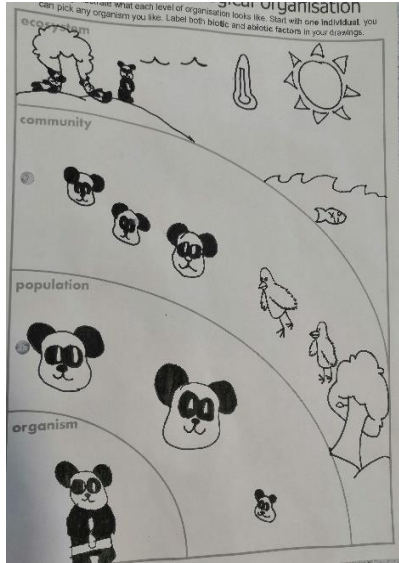
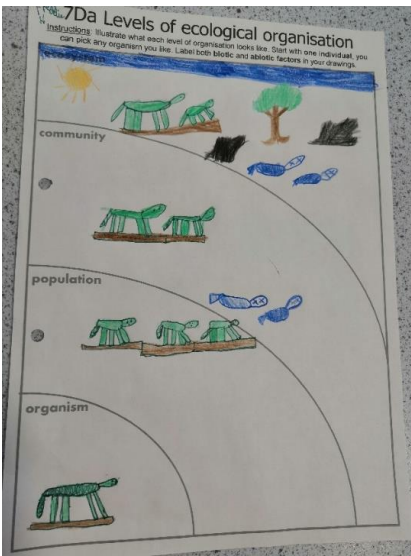

Surrey Schools Athletics Championships

We would like to congratulate the children who were selected for the Surrey Championships this year. We had a record high of five athletes across both age categories: Ava, William, Samuel, Oliver and Lily.

Three of the children were available for the day; Ava, William and Samuel. It was a perfect day for spectators, albeit a little warm for the athletes. The first challenge of the day was to get a parking spot at the venue!

William qualified for javelin and hurdles but athletes can only compete in one event so he had to choose between the two. He chose 80m hurdles! William was up first for his Junior Boys heat and easily went through to the finals.

We knew he only really had one competitor to challenge him and it couldn't have been any closer in the final. They were neck and neck the whole way and nobody could call it on the line. Nail-biting stuff! William ran a personal best and, at that moment in time, was the 5<sup>th</sup> fastest in the UK for his age group this year! The results went up and the judges deemed William the silver medallist by 0.01second. Incredible performance!

Ava had a very tough heat and faced fierce competition in the Junior Girls 800m. Sadly, this meant that she didn't qualify on this occasion but no doubt will be back in contention next year.

Samuel was competing in the intermediate Boys 800m. His heat was a very tactical race. He knew he needed a top two finish to qualify but also wanted to conserve as much energy as possible for the final. He sat comfortably in second for the whole race, only needing to go a bit faster than he needed along the home stretch. The final showed Samuel's quality from the very start. He led from the break and continued to push throughout, gaining a convincing win by a clear 10m. A brilliant performance.

Good luck to those competing for the Surrey Schools team in the next stage this weekend. We couldn't be more proud of all of our athletes.
