




Each week we feature a book that may appeal to secondary school age pupils.

#### YEAR 8 CRICKET

On Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> June the Year 8 cricket team travelled to Wallington County Grammar School for their quarter final fixture of the Surrey County Cup.

Debutant Harry came into bowl and took two back to back wickets, from there they started to roll in with Wallington finishing 116 all out, leaving Reigate needing 117 to win.
