

If your child is eligible for Free School Meals they will be allocated £2.65 each day to purchase food from the canteen. Any amounts left over each day will not roll over to the next day. If additional food is purchased above the £2.65 limit then this will be charged to your SCOPAY account and you will need to pay the difference.



With wetsuits and buoyancy aids on we chose our boats and paddles and got on the water. Initially, some struggled to move in a straight line whilst others such as Matty, Kye and Sophie, showed a smooth, effortless action. Techniques were adapted throughout the morning and Dominic's skeg adjusted which made a huge difference.

After lunch we got onto filming the launching and disembarking. This made for many giggles. Nevertheless, everyone persevered to get good quality evidence.

The biggest test of day one was definitely the timed two laps, a taster of the long journey 3k paddle. All managed it well, despite a few injuries and aches coming out.

It was a hard day's work rewarded with some fun on the kayak slide to finish the day.

YEAR 9 CRICKET

On Thursday 15th September Year 9 played against Gordon's School at Salfords CC

After a strong season last summer the Year 8 team made it to the final of the County Cup Plate competition. This involves all the best teams from the state schools in Surrey, making it a great achievement to reach the final.

Due to fixture congestion, this match was played after the summer holidays at Salfords CC on what was slightly damp conditions and a tricky wicket to bat on. Having lost the toss we were put into bat on a green wicket with lots of uneven bounce. The Gordon's School bowling attack was absolutely outstanding with no weaknesses, they all bowled with disciplined lines and length making it very difficult to score. Our only players to reach double figures were Sam White and Joshua Campbell, both scoring 10 runs in a total of 52 all out of just 15 overs. Many of our batsman struggled to judge how to bat in these conditions, with many thinking we needed to be more attacking and get a score of 100 runs or more, when actually a score of around 80 runs would have been competitive.



Our performance in the field was excellent, with Ryandeep Bhole (1-8) and Bella Barton (0-8) bowling a tight opening 6 overs, going for just 16 runs and Ryan picking up a wicket. However, the introduction of spin started to make a difference with George Ross (2-18) and Sam White (2-7) both picking up key wickets in their top order. Harry Ward picked up two excellent run outs, one with a direct hit, leaving Gordon's nervous on 42-7. However, a lower order batsman came in to score two quick boundaries to take the game away from us. A few more runs on the board in the first innings could have been the difference.

This is the first game I have taken with the team as Mr Webb took them last year, despite losing I was extremely impressed with the whole attitude of the team throughout and the fighting spirit shown in the second innings. I look forward to seeing more of them play over the next couple of years and hopefully take home the silverware!


