SKI TRIP 2023



On Saturday 1st April 61 children and 7 members of staff flew from Gatwick to Passo Tonale, Italy for a week of skiing. After the long task of getting ski boots and skis fitted for such a large group we were ready on the slopes for our first lesson at 11am on the Sunday. We had an intermediate group and an advanced group who had all skied before so they set off with their instructors. The remaining children who had never skied before were split into two larger groups to learn the basics, then divided again to create four beginner groups. The children remained in these ski groups throughout the week.

A member of Reigate School staff stayed with each ski group during the day and we rotated which group we skied with so we all got to see the progress made by every group. For those learning to ski for the first time, those first few days were particularly demanding both physically and mentally. Many spent a lot of time falling over and struggling to understand the concepts described by the Italian instructors. Despite a few moans and groans they all persevered really well and soon mastered the basics and were ready for the higher slopes. Being the end of the season the snow at the bottom of the mountain was not fun to ski on so everyone really found their way once they got higher up the piste.

The intermediate and advanced groups were clocking up a number of ski miles each day and were quickly enjoying the fresh snow on the glacier and tackling some challenging black runs from the 3000m mark at the top of the mountain. They were also loving the challenge of some safe off-piste skiing at the edges of the red runs and some small jumps which were very entertaining to watch at times! Towards the end of the week some of the children taking GCSE PE and GCSE Sports Studies skied with the PE staff to record some footage of them skiing as part of their PE examination course.


The weather was glorious – with blue skies and sunshine most days but there was a definite lack of fresh snow. We headed down off the mountain at 5pm every day and enjoyed time relaxing at the hotel. There was a games room with table tennis, foosball, pool and the very popular karaoke. We also enjoyed a meal out at a pizza restaurant one night, a quiz night, and an ice cream out another evening. On the final day the ski instructors came to our hotel to celebrate the success of all the children and present certificates.

This was such an enjoyable trip and memories were made that will last a life time for both staff and children. We will be launching details of the ski trip in 2025 soon so keep an eye out for that if you are interested.

The first activity was to find out what a university is and how it is different from school.


There were some games and activities to get them thinking, as they had to design their own university in groups after lunch.






