NEW YORK TRIP 2023

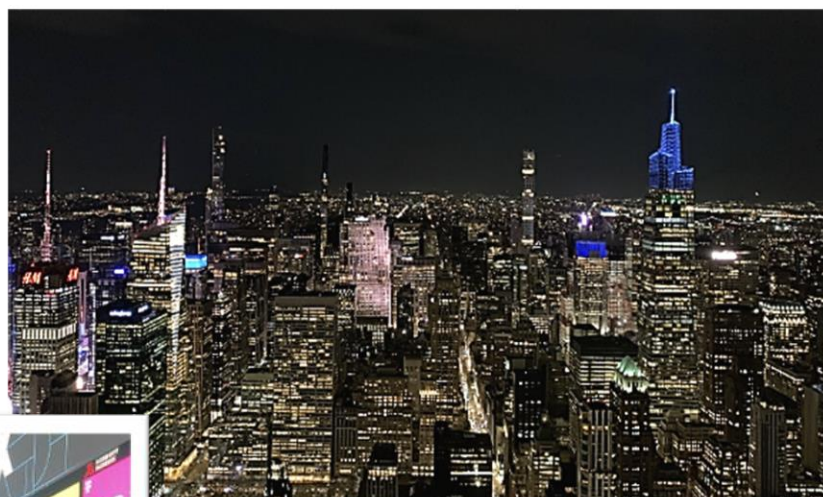
Wow!! What a trip we had!

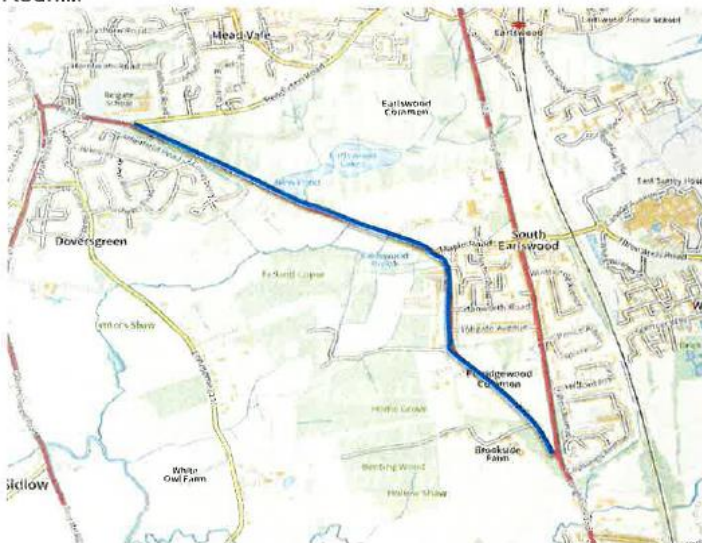

Works area:

Woodhatch Road, Redhill will be closed from the junction with Pendleton Road to the junction with Horley Road whilst we carry out our pre-patching works.
