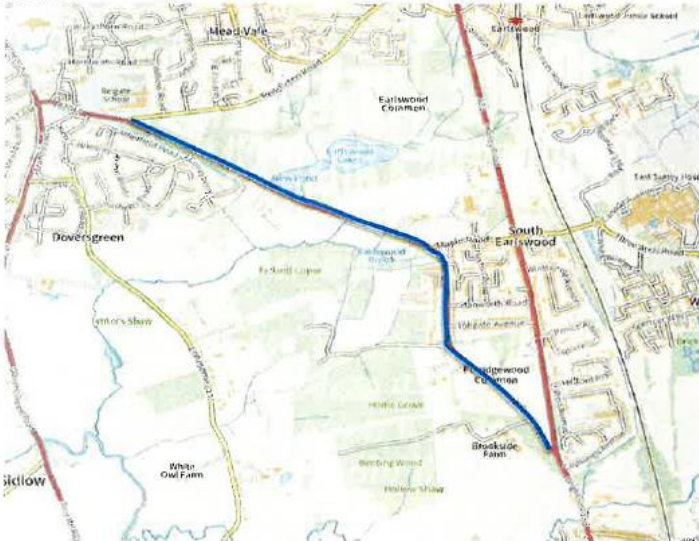

We will be carrying out pre-patching works on Woodhatch Road, Redhill.



Works area:

Woodhatch Road, Redhill will be closed from the junction with Pendleton Road to the junction with Horley Road whilst we carry out our pre-patching works.
