February and April were the months for the Maths Challenges. The competitions are run by the UK Mathematics Trust and Reigate School had 50 children from Years 9 and 10 and 100 children from Years 7 and 8 taking part. Well done to Samuel Stapley who has had an exciting couple of weeks, winning the Surrey County Championships U17 Boys 800m on 13th May. On Saturday 20th May he ran in an invitational race at Parliament Hill in London. It was the Night of the 10000m PBs which is a prominent adult competition with big crowds and used as selection for GB athletes for the World Championships, but just before the adult championship races they put on some U17 and U20 800m races for selected junior athletes to compete in. It was a very exciting and fast race, with Samuel pushing on the home straight to come in 3rd in a time of 1:53.72 which was a huge PB for him and means he has now achieved national standard in the English Schools criteria, and he retains his position as 3rd in the UK currently.
