The Topic is: Transition and Safety

- 6. Safety outside school road, rail, water
- 7. Responding in an emergency and first aid

#### Year 8

The **Topic** is: *Drugs and Alcohol* 

The **Lessons** are;

- 1. Understanding caffeine
- 2. How to assess the risk of tobacco, nicotine and e-cigs
- 3. Alcohol and Risk
- 4. Cannabis
- 5. How to use over the counter prescription medications safely
- 6. How to manage influences in relation to substance use
- 7. How to recognise and promote social norms and attitudes

#### Year 9

The **Topic** is: Peer Influence, Substance Use and Gangs

The **Lessons** are;

- 1. How to distinguish between healthy and unhealthy friendships
- 2. How to assess risk and manage influence including Groupthink and how it affects behaviour
- 3. How to recognise passive, aggressive and assertive behaviour and communicate assertively
- 4. How to manage risk in relation to gangs, legal and health risks, addiction and dependence
- 5. Alcohol positive social norms, legal and health risks, addiction and dependence
- 6. Drugs positive social norms, legal and health risks, addiction and dependence

#### **Year 10**

The **Topic** is: *Mental Health* 

The **Lessons** are;

- 1. How to manage challenges during adolescence
- 2. How to refrain from negative thinking
- 3. Strategies to promote mental health and emotional well-being
- 4. Signs of emotional or mental health
- 5. The portrayal of mental health in the media
- 6. How to challenge stigma, stereotypes and misinformation

The Topic is: Living in the Wider World

The **Lessons** are;





# Starting a new school?

Your child will be learning and socialising with more children when they start their new school and could be at risk of catching preventable diseases if they haven't had all their childhood jabs.





If you are not sure if your child has had all their routine vaccinations, check their personal health record (Red Book) or contact the GP surgery. To get the best protection for your child, they need to have had two doses of MMR vaccine. For a checklist of the vaccines and the ages at which they should ideally be given visit:
