
YEAR 10

After lunch, we walked into the city centre to see some of Cambridge's famous sites. We visited the site




Well done to all our Year 11s on the visit. You were absolutely fantastic!





ONLINE SAFETY

Are you worried about your child's online safety? Here are our top tips to help you based on the latest research and expert advice on how to keep your child safe online:

- Talk openly and frequently with your child about what they are doing online, use conversation starters to help them share their experiences and opinions.
- Check the ratings, reviews and enforce age limits on apps, games and sites used.
- Keep screen devices in shared areas of the house to help you monitor your child's online activity and limit their screen time.
- Report any incidents of online abuse, bullying, harassment, or inappropriate content to the school, the app or website, or a helpline. Remember to also contact the Police if there are any concerns surrounding grooming, exploitation or malicious communication.
- Manage privacy settings on the apps and websites that your child uses.
- Make sure they understand the importance of not sharing personal information Check & turn off apps with geolocation enabled.
- Engage in other activities & socialise outside of online games and apps.
- Help your child maintain a balance between their online and offline friendships.
