MATHS CHALLENGE

This term a team of two Year 9S and two Year 8s represented Reigate School in a Team Maths Challenge. These children were selected because of their excellent performance in Maths and their regular attendance at Maths Club.

The Challenge took place at Wilsons School in Wallington and was organised by the UK Mathematics Trust. It was made up of four parts, including a relay round where you had to use the answer to one question to work out the answer to the next.

Below is an example of the relay.

Reigate School achieved 5th place out of 20 teams from the local area. They scored only 7 points less than the winning team. Well done to Toby, Esme, Lily and Freya for this excellent performance. Here are some of the comments sent to us about them on the day.

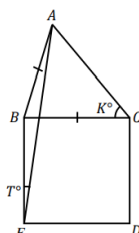

U13 GIRLS' CRICKET FESTIVAL

The recent Girls Cricket Festival at Merstham Cricket Club was a thrilling event, showcasing the talent and sportsmanship of the young players.

First Match: Victory Against Royal Alexandra and Albert School

Reigate started strong with an impressive batting performance, scoring 52 runs with only 2 wickets lost. RAAS struggled to match up, scoring just 7 runs and losing 4 wickets.
