DRAMA TRIP



YEAR 11 FOOTBALL

In a thrilling encounter in the 1st round of the Surrey Cup, Reigate's U16 Girls football team pulled off a stunning comeback to beat Winston Churchill 3-2, securing their place in the next round.

The game got off to a tough start for Reigate, conceding within the first five minutes. A Winston Churchill corner found an unmarked player in the box, who calmly put them ahead. Moments later, a goal-line scramble resulted in another Winston Churchill goal, leaving Reigate 2-0 down and struggling early on. To make matters worse, key player Sophia suffered an injury and was replaced by Ava.

Despite the scoreline, Reigate played an evenly matched first half. Their efforts and quality did not reflect in the 2-0 deficit going into the break, but they remained determined.

The second half saw a revitalized Reigate take control from the whistle. Five minutes in, Tilly delivered a well-placed corner, which Elissia met with precision to score Reigate's first goal, giving them a crucial lifeline. Reigate continued to press, and ten minutes later, after Lola's powerful shot rattled the crossbar, another goal-line scramble ensued. This time, Bella was there to dribble the ball over the line, levelling the match at 2-2.

Winston Churchill found themselves in trouble soon after, as their goalkeeper handled the ball outside the area while under pressure from Josie. Though the keeper escaped a red card, Tilly slotted a low free kick but unfortunately it went into the wall.

In a nail-biting finale, with just one minute remaining, Annabel dribbled skilfully down the line, delivering a perfect cross to Bella, who found Tilly in the box. Tilly made no mistake, scoring the winner to seal a dramatic 3-2 victory.

All the players contributed to this memorable win, with special praise for Elissia, who was a rock in defence, Tilly for her creativity and perfectly placed goal, Bella for controlling the midfield, and Lola for her electrifying runs down the right wing. The Year 9 players, stepping up to support the squad, were also commendable, showing resilience against physically strong opponents.
