YEAR 9 FOOTBALL

Reigate School's U14 football team secured an emphatic 4-0 victory over the Whitgift School in the 2nd round of the Surrey Cup, with an inspired performance from Musa, who bagged a hat-trick and an assist. The home side's dominance was evident from the outset, coupled with a resolute defensive display that denied Whitgift any chance of a comeback.

Reigate started with a bang, taking the lead in just the second minute. Taylor, showing excellent vision from centre-back, threaded a cutting pass-through midfield to find Musa. Holding off his marker, Musa played a neat one-two with Reuben, who squared the ball back for Musa to tap home and make it 1-0.

The opening exchanges saw steady play from both sides, but Whitgift nearly equalised from a corner. A spectacular overhead kick at the back post looped towards goal, only to clip the top of the crossbar.

Reigate responded with Freddie's long-range free kick, which forced a sharp save from the Whitgift goalkeeper after 15 minutes.

However, a nervy moment followed when a poor clearance from Josh, under pressure from a back pass, led to a Whitgift shot that narrowly missed the target.

Reigate's defensive line was caught out trying to play offside at the 20-minute mark, allowing the Whitgift striker a clear run on goal. Josh, quick to react, brought him down but immediately redeemed himself with a fantastic penalty save to maintain the lead.

Reigate doubled their lead after 25 minutes. Alex made a surging run down the flank and delivered a pinpoint cross for Musa to apply a simple finish for his second goal of the game.

The second half began with Reigate pushing for more goals. Musa came close to a hat-trick when his free kick smashed against the crossbar, only for Freddie to head the rebound over. Moments later, Theo's effort was saved, and Jack's follow-up shot was blocked.

Whitgift grew into the match during a more even second half, but Reigate's defence, marshalled superbly by Stan, Taylor, Harry, and Jack, held firm. Isaac provided a spark on the wing with some dazzling footwork, cutting inside and forcing a save from a low-driven shot.

The breakthrough came when Musa was fouled on the edge of the box. Stepping up confidently, he curled the resulting free kick into the corner to complete his hat-trick and extend Reigate's lead to 3-0.

Reigate sealed the win in style late on. Musa's brilliant work down the wing ended with a cutback to Theo, who calmly slotted the ball into the bottom corner to make it 4-0.

A composed and clinical performance from Reigate saw them cruise into the next round. The team combined attacking flair with defensive resilience, with standout contributions from Musa and the backline.
