The Audition Process!

All casting is based on the audition performance; Teachers make decisions based on the performance on the day, and what is the best fit for each part. This is an outline of the process -

- Attend the show launch where you will be given the singing, dancing, and acting audition pieces to learn.
- Look out for the audition times and learn your pieces. It is not necessary to be off script for auditions, but you'll be able to show off more of your acting if you know it off by heart!
- The cast list will be posted on the Performing Arts noticeboards no later than the week after auditions.
(As we have large numbers that audition there is not always the capacity for individual feedback).

It is always disappointing if you don't get the part you wanted, but it is part of performance resilience. Remember to dust yourself off and try again next year or take part in the ensemble or some other way; for example - scene painting, prop making and costumes.

YEAR 7 FOOTBALL



Reigate School hosted Raynes Park High School on Monday 14th October in a thrilling showdown, for the first round of the Surrey Cup. Both teams came to the game with little understanding of their respective team, as they are still getting to know each other, but had something to prove, and they didn't disappoint. This was Reigate School's second game of the season, after a 5-1 win against St.Bede's in the opening game of the league season.

The first 5-10 minutes of the game were very cagey, but Reigate dominated. The back line looked solid, and the midfield and attack were trying to find their calm to get the ball into the back of the opposition net. Eddy pulled off an incredible save up close, ensuring we didn't go behind. Fin attempted a bicycle kick, which just drifted wide – it would have been the goal of the season! After some more minutes passed, Reigate won a free kick, Henry took the shot, he crossed it into the box and Logan was there to slot

it away. 1-0! From this point forward, Reigate were on fire. Henry, this time from the corner flag, played it into to Fin, who calmly headed it into the bottom left corner. 2-0! Freddie then found himself through on goal, but unselfishly assisted Henry who had an open net to make it 3-0! Then a free kick from captain Isaac assisted Fin to make it 4-0! These three quick goals ensured Reigate entered half time more comfortably than if it were only 1-0. But we knew work was still needed to ensure progression into the next round of the cup.

At halftime, substitutions were made, and positive team talks from the coaches ensured the boys kept the right mentality and didn't take their lead for granted. A second half of constant work from everyone, Zac and Joel ensuring both wings were defended, both Fins bossing the middle, and a lethal attack led to more goals. Freddie scored 2 quick well taken goals, both into bottom left corner to make it 6-0 to Reigate. Then later a handball from a Raynes Park defender inside their box meant it was a penalty to Reigate! Josh wanted to get on the scoresheet, so stood up to take it, and he scored into the top left corner to make it 7-0 to Reigate.

The game ended and Reigate came out victorious with a 7-0 victory over Raynes Park. The boys celebrated and were very happy with their achievement. This means Reigate are now 2 wins from 2 games – a very impressive start. All credit goes to the boys who show a lot of teamwork and fight during the games. Massive congratulations to some of the boys on their debut today. Thank you to all the other Year 7s who turn up every week to training on Wednesday, this team needs competition to be able to do well and keep standards high, which is what Reigate School is all about.

YEAR 8 FOOTBALL

The opening round of the U13 Surrey Cup saw Reigate School face off against Richard Challoner School in a tightly contested match on Thursday 17th October. Reigate dominated possession in the first half, with Oliver S making an early impact by hitting the crossbar within the first five minutes. Despite their control, Reigate missed a crucial opportunity to take the lead, failing to convert a penalty after 11 minutes. They continued to apply pressure, and after 20 minutes, a header from a free kick narrowly missed the target, going just over the bar. Richard Challoner posed a threat just before halftime, hitting the crossbar with a header, leaving the scoreline 0-0 at the break.



The second half saw more action, with Ayman making an important save 11 minutes in to keep the score level. However, just one minute later, Richard Challoner broke the deadlock, scoring a header from a corner. Challoner's pressure continued, but Reigate remained resilient, and in the 26th minute, Joe equalized with a header, sending the game into a penalty shootout.

In the end, Reigate was unfortunate, losing 3-2 on penalties, despite their strong performance throughout the match. It was a hard-fought contest, but Richard Challoner progressed to the next round.
