Attendance & Punctuality



- Attendance is how many days you are in school
- Punctuality is being on time
- More than ever having missed a lot of school, it's essential that your attendance and punctuality are excellent
- As a school, we expect a minimum of 98% attendance as this links to your future chances
- We expect you to be on time to school every day, including each lesson. Poor punctuality will be followed up via after school restore sessions

GETTING YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL ON TIME REALLY MATTERS!

DID YOU KNOW...

If in a school year your child is late everyday by...	your child would have lost approximately...	or they would have missed approximately...
5 minutes	3.5 days from school	20 lessons
10 minutes	7 days from school	41 lessons
15 minutes	10 days from school	55 lessons
20 minutes	14.5 days from school	82 lessons
30 minutes	22 days from school	123 lessons

**YOU SHOULD NOT TAKE YOUR CHILD ON HOLIDAY DURING THE TERM TIME
PLEASE ENCOURAGE PUNCTUALITY TO MAINTAIN SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

Attendance – Why is it *important*?

- There are only 40 teaching weeks in the school year; there are 12 weeks of holiday.
- Missing six days every term of every year is the same as missing one whole school year
- 95% attendance sounds good, but means that you are taking one day off a month.
- 95% attendance decreases your chances of achieving 5+ GCSE 5-9 grades by TEN PERCENT compared to 100% attendance!
