Our Curriculum



The curriculum at Reigate School is designed to inspire and challenge all children and prepare them for the future. Our aim is to teach a broad and balanced curriculum that equips children:

- for further education and employment.
- to become responsible citizens who make a positive contribution to society.
- to live safe, healthy and fulfilling lives.

Reigate School aims to offer children a wide range of extra-curricular enrichment opportunities across all year groups. These enrichment activities include trips during and outside school hours. Please see our website for listed opportunities.

We provide personalised Literacy and Numeracy programmes to improve achievement for all.

The curriculum has strong links to real life in the work of work and enterprise.



Pastoral

The Reigate School experience is much more than teaching and learning; it aims to help all children to develop personally, emotionally and socially. Our strong pastoral care and support system links regularly with the home and our families.

All students will follow a specific Tutor programme throughout their five years at Reigate school.

This Tutor programme includes the Reigate Character programme, Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development (SMSC), Reigate School Expectations and Reigate School Values. This programme includes twice weekly Whole Year group Assemblies. These assemblies celebrate student successes and educate students in areas including Careers, Mental Health, Anti-Bullying, Human Rights, Safeguarding, Sexual abuse, Online Safety, Black History month, Remembrance Day and Disability History Month.

At Reigate School, we firmly believe that all children benefit from regular school attendance which supports their academic progress, social skills and emotional wellbeing. For this reason, we strive to ensure that children achieve their maximum possible attendance and that any problems that prevent full attendance are identified and acted upon promptly.

Admissions

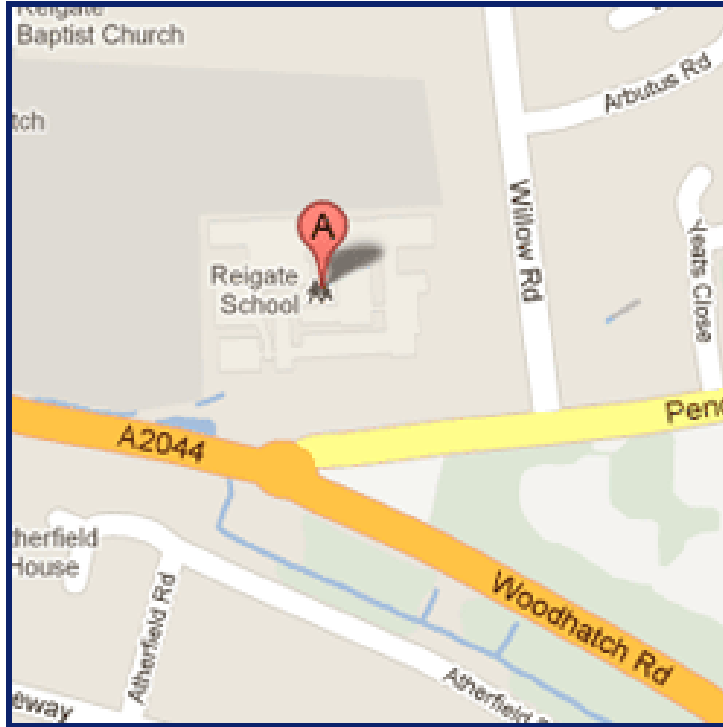
Greensand Multi-Academy Trust is the admission authority for Reigate School. The Published Admission Number for initial entry into Reigate School in September 2023 is 250.

Applications for admission at the normal intake will be managed in accordance with Surrey's coordinated scheme for secondary admission. Applications for admission to Year 7 must be made by Monday 31st October 2022. Places at Surrey schools will be offered on the basis of the preferences that are shown on the application form. Applicants will be asked to rank up to six Year 7 preferences and these will be considered under an equal preference system.

Children with an education, health and care plan (EHCP) that names the school will be allocated a place before other children are considered. In this way, the number of places available will be reduced by the number of children with an education, health and care plan that names the school.
